[4/2088 مسلم Asbahna wa-asbahal-mulku lillah walhamdu lillah la ilaha illal-lah, wahdahu la shareeka lah, lahul-mulku walahul-hamd, wahuwa 'ala kulli shayin qadeer, rabbi as-aluka khayra ma ba'daho, wa-a'oothu bika min sharri hatha-alyawmi, wakhayra ma ba'daho, rabbi a'oothu bika minal-kasal, wasoo-il kibar, rabbi a'oothu bika min 'athabin fin-nar, wa 'athabin fil-qabr. We arrived in the morning and at this very moment Allah belongs to all sovereignty, and all praise is for Allah. In the evening you say, amsayna wa amsal mulku liillah... and replaces 'hatha-alyawmi' with hathihil-layla. [Saheeh Muslim 4/2088, Silsilah Ahadeeth as-Saheehah, n. 262, 1/525.] Sheikh Ibn 'Uthaymeen (may Allah have mercy on him) said: The author (may Allah have mercy on him) said: Chapter on dhikr in the morning and evening. What he meant by morning and evening was at the beginning of the day, and at the end of the day and the beginning of the night. The morning begins when the sunrise breaks and ends when the sun has risen to the exoneration. And the evening begins with the prayer of the Asr and ends with the prayer 'Isha' or through it. Final guote from Sharh Riyadh as-Saaliheen Ibn al-Qayyim (may Allah have mercy on him) said: Chapter on the memory of Allah (dhikr) at both ends of the day (as mentioned in Hud 11:114), which are the times between Fair and dawn, and between 'Asr and ' Maghrib. Allah, may He be glorified and exalted) says: O you who believe! Remember Allah with a lot of remembrance. And glorify His Praises morning and afternoon [al-Ahzaab 33:41-42]. The afternoon: al-Jawhari said: This is the moment after 'Asr to Maghrib. Allah, may He be exalted, says (interpretation of meaning): and glorifies the praises of your Lord in the Ashiy (i.e. the period of time after the middle finger until sunset) and in the Ibkaar (i.e. the period of time from early morning or dawn until before midnoon) [Ghaafir 40:55]. The ibkaar is the beginning of the day and the ashiy is the end of the day. Allah, may He be exalted, say (interpretation of meaning): and glorify the praises of your Lord before the rising of the sun, and before the rising of the sun, and before his sunset [Ta-Ha 20:130]. This interpretation is what is mentioned in the 1980s about saying this or that in the morning and evening. What is meant is before the sun rises and before it sets. So the time for these adhkaar is after Fair and after 'Asr. And Suhayl bin Saalih, who is one of the narrators of this narrative, said: Our people had learned this plea and recited it every night when a teenager was stally but did not suffer from pain or affliction (from the sting).
