With the cost of school supplies rising and the number of supplies required from schools going up, it is costing more and more to buy school supplies each year. If you have a few school-aged kids then your costs can easily reach hundreds of dollars each year. Whether you're a parent who can't find money in your budget to buy school supplies this year, or you're trying to stretch your budget, see below to find some ways you can get free school supplies for your kids this year. Your first step to getting free school supplies should be by contacting your child's school. Often schools will buy extra supplies each year that they can provide for families who are unable to buy them. Sometimes teachers will even use part of their classroom budget to buy extra supplies for their students. If you are not successful in your child's individual school, you will want to contact your school district. Many school districts have programs created where the community can donate school supplies that they can then give out to families who need them. If they don't have a program created, they will likely have information about city-wide programs that give out free school supplies. Reaching out to society should be your next step in getting free school supplies. All kinds of organizations set up programs to give out school supplies, you just need to figure out who they are in your community. You can contact your local news stations and newspapers. This is who organizations are giving out school supplies contact when they want to get the word out about their program. If your local media are not familiar with any programs, they will most likely be able to do the footwork to find out where those programs are. Other sites that often set up free school delivery programs include local universities, churches and charities like Volunteers of America and United Way. If you are a military family, Operation Homefront partners up with Dollar Tree every year to provide free backpacks and school supplies. You can you back-to-school brigade to take take of this amazing program. If you want to stretch your back to school budget, seeing free after-discount deals will help you score quite a few free school supplies. Many stores offer free after-discount deals on school supplies, and you'll need to see your Sunday circulars to see if there are any deals for the week. Staples has a program called Easy Discounts that makes it really easy to get free school supplies in July and August. Free after-discount items can make stores money because so many people forget to send in the discount. Make sure you submit your discount so you get your money back or your school supplies won't be free anyway. Don't hesitate to take advantage of free after-discount school supplies that aren't on your child's school delivery list this year. Put it away for next year or better yet, donate it. Back to school shopping is big business for stores and they are looking to get you in and spend money. They will often have door busts to get you in the door. You want to start seeing newspaper ads in July and start visiting each store to pick up only the really good deals.
