In addition to 3 years of experience working in the field, applicants must have a bachelor's or master's degree from a regionally recognized college or university with an average score of 2.5 or better in their last 60 course credits. Sam Houston State University Distance learnr can take advantage of Sam Houston State University's master of science in project management degree. The exact growth trend will depend on the specific industry. The areas that will grow the most in the coming years will be health care, construction, finance and oil and gas. According to the Center for Education and the Workforce, workers with bachelor's degrees earn \$2.3 million in lifetime income, while those with master's degrees will earn \$2.7 million.
