He played for Benfica in the 2013–14 season. He moved to Valencia in July 2014 and signed for Barcelona two years later. After a year on loan at Everton, he signed an indefinite contract in 2019. Gomes made 37 appearances for Portugal at all youth levels, including six for the under-21s. He represented the nation at Euro 2016 – winning the tournament – and the 2017 Confederations Cup. Benfica club career Born in Grijó, Vila Nova de Gaia, Porto District, [2] Gomes joined the youth system of S.L. Benfica at the age of 18, playing last year as a junior with the Lisbon club. On July 28, 2012, he played in the first match against Gil Vicente, [4] and spent his first season in the senior reserves team, competing in the Segunda Liga. Gomes scored his first goals against Benfica B in league matches against Braga B (2-2 draw at home) and Belenenses (6-0, also at home). On October 18, 2012, he made his debut in the starting line-up, playing 25 minutes after going 4-0 up against Taça de Portugal. Appearance. However, he was still mainly associated with Team B. On 31 January 2014. Benfica (and Benfica Stars Fund) have sold 100% of Gomes' business rights to meriton capital limited for €15 million plus 25% of the future transfer fee. He remained at Estádio da Luz until the end of the campaign. [10] On April 16, 2014, Gomes played a full 90 minutes in a rematch of the Portuguese Cup semi-final, winning 3-1 after a brilliant individual effort to help his team, who played with one man less than 60 minutes against Porto, win the draw 3-2 on a two-match series. [12] The season ended with 23 matches in all competitions, helping the club win the first triple in its history (league, cup and Taça da Liga). Valencia signed Valencia on 17 July 2014,[14] Although his business rights were owned by Peter Lima, a loan deal was agreed to take him and Rodrigo to the Spanish club due to the purchase of lim the latter. Gomes made his La Liga debut on 23 August 2014 in a 1-1 away draw with Sevilla. He scored his first goal of the season on 22 September, scoring his second 3–0 away win against Getafe. On 12 June 2015, Benfica and Valencia announced that they had reached an agreement on Gomes' rights. He then signed with the Spaniard until 30 June 2020. [19] On 21 July 2016, Barcelona reached an agreement with Valencia to transfer Gomes for EUR 35 million plus EUR 20 million. He made his debut on 17 August in a 3-0 home win against Sevilla in the SuperCopa de España and was directly involved in two goals. [23] Gomes scored his first goal for the team on 19 March 2017, closing out a 4-2 win against his former club Valencia. He was voted the worst player of the season by Readers of March. In the Copa del Rey final, he replaced the injured Javier Mascherano early in the first half against Alavés, playing mainly as a right-back and providing an assist to Neymar, who equalised the second in a possible 3-1 triumph. On 9 August 2018, Everton's Gomes and Chelsea's David Luiz, despite suffering a leg injury in the pre-season, moved to English side Everton on loan for €2.25 million. He made his Premier League debut on 21 October, playing 82 minutes in a 2–0 win against Crystal Palace on 2 February 2019. Aleksandar Mitrović's fulham leg-to-leg ban during the 2-0 defeat at Craven Cottage. On 25 June, he signed a five-year, £22 million contract. On 3 November 2019, Gomes suffered a serious ankle injury in his Home Premier League match against Tottenham Hotspur after a match against Son Heung-min and a subsequent collision with Serge Aurier. Referee Martin Atkinson was initially supposed to give Son a yellow card, but changed it to red after realising the seriousness of the situation. A red card was later rejected by The Football Association, [37] while Gomes was due to make a full recovery from a successful operation. On 23 February 2020, Gomes returned from injury in the second half of Everton's 3-2 win over Arsenal. In 2017, Gomes played against Russia at the FIFA Gomes Confederations Cup, where he represented Portugal at the 2012 Fifa Under-19 European Championship. At the age of 19, he received his first call-up to the senior team for a friendly match against Ecuador on February 6, 2013,[41] but remained unused in a 2–3 home loss. Gomes made his debut on 7 September 2014, starting and playing for the full 90 minutes in a 1–0 loss to Albania at the Estádio Municipal de Aveiro in the UEFA Euro 2016 qualifiers. In the first leg against Iceland in Saint-Étienne, he drew 1–1 with Iceland, where he assisted on Nani's goal and was replaced by Eder at the end of the second half. In 2018, he was included in the 35-man squad for the 2018 Fifa World Cup,[48] but was not included in the final.
