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Pressure washer manual

Water. Last year's purchase of a pressure pad made life easier for us in so many ways and in so many places. But of course our launch into the joys of pressure pads began with a problem: we had some outdoor carpets that were turning green from eyelash growth, and none of our conventional cleaning methods would remove staining, especially on ties. We tried using a high-performance nozzle on a regular garden hose, tried various spray cleaners and commercial removers on site, and even brought our trusty carpet steamer outside – all to no avail. Some of our friends suggested we try to use their pressure washer, and voila: stains removed, outdoor carpets stored! We immediately started looking for our own pressure pads (also known as dishwasher energy), shopping at big home improvement stores, hardware stores and garden centers. We found that there are countless models to choose from, at prices ranging from \$200 to \$2,000. Pressure washers are evaluated according to the water pressure they produce. Most standard garden hoses deliver between £40 to £60 per square inch (PSI), while pressure pads deliver from 1,400 to 4,000 PSI. The pressure washer takes water from the garden hose and pushes it through a small high pressure nozzle, creating a supercharged stream of water that can be used alone or in combination with a detergent. Medium-duty pressure pads produce 2,000 to 3,000 PSI and can be used to remove grease and gloom from concrete, sidewalks, decks and lifts. High-performance pressure pads produce 3000 PSI or more and can be used to quickly clean large areas, remove stubborn or rust stains or take off paint. There are also various commercial pressure washers on the market, but if you have a job that extensive, you probably would be better off calling in a professional pressure washing service. Another key factor in choosing a pressure washer is how much water is put out, which is known as flow rate and is expressed as gallons per minute (GPM). The higher the flow rate, the faster the pressure washer cleans the area. Most residential pressure beading has a flow rate of 2 to 4 GPM. Interestingly, the use of pressure washer can actually save significantly on water consumption. Garden hose working at 60 PSI uses about 900 gallons per hour so far pressure pressure works at 1400 PSI using only about 100 gallons per hour. We chose an electrically powered, medium-duty pressure washer rated at 2,000 PSI because we figured it would be most versatile for home and garden use, and we were pretty happy with our choice.
