Upper-class women who had free time set the trends. ♦ 1910 The decade after 1910 was influenced by the First World War (1914-1919). A fashion trend was hobbled skirts, lace-up boots, and countless dresses that were elongated with inverted triangles. There were ankle skirts and flowing ankle dresses which caused a very big deal. ♦ 1920s 1920s fashion was influenced by jazz, the Harlem Renaissance, the 19th Amendment and Prohibition. Events led a fashion revolution in women's clothing with smaller corsets, the introduction of bras, higher hems, interesting new styles, and clamshell dresses that were loose and had long beads. After the short dresses of the 1920s, the fashion of the 1930s became more feminine as a reintroduction of the natural waistline and longer skirt lengths gave the feminine shape a more elegant and slim look. This more conservative trend was influenced by movie stars and the Era of the Great Depression. ♦ women's fashion from the 1940s to the 1940s was influenced by the army due to World War II. Women wore square shoulders, narrow hips and skirts that ended just below the knee, and the pants initially gained popularity for women. ♦ 1950s was influenced by Rock and Roll which led teenagers to have their own fashion trends. The teenage girls wore poodle skirts, saddle shoes and a new introduction of Capri pants that wore closely at the waist with a tuck in blouse. Women's fashion was influenced by movie stars like Marilyn Monroe who inspired tiny belts and skirts and full busts and thin pencil-line skirts were also popular. Women's clothing was more elegant than teenage girls which was more bee bop. ♦ 1960s The 1960s were when people became dissatisfied with the government, tended to communism and rebelled by fashion. This complemented various movements, including the civil rights movement and the women's rights movement. The style was developed by the different movements. The 1960s was a decade with the beginning of bright and swirling colors, Bell backgrounds, hippie look, very short skirts and warm pants. ♦ 1970 The 70s were a continuation of 60s with bright colors, low bell pants and hippie look that led to the introduction of the Disco look and African culture was introduced as well. Fashion trends included unisex clothing, bold floral prints, flat-to-platform shoes and bell bottom pants. ♦ 1980 Fashion in the 1980s quickly changed and became more and more diverse. He was influenced by technology and the expansion of cable television and networks due to celebrities and music videos. Popular clothing for women and teenagers was exercise wear, logo wear and designer jeans. Two popular types of models for women were Power Dressing and Material Girl/Valley girl. ♦ 1990s The 90s were the age of technology, women's fashion was minimalist and influenced by 60 and 70 and street fashion. Trends in the 90s were babydoll dresses, denim, two formal pieces, and the grunge look. Every decade of the 20th century marked a renaissance of fashion and a memory in history. People and styles have become admired in every decade; they created pop culture icons on and off the runway. Many people adapted the fashion of the time as a form of self-expression, others as a form of rebellion. Fashion has always been part of its personal and cultural identity, and the 20th century has been filled with decades full of both. We can see fashion as a two-stranded stiletto heel: it moulded us, and we molded it. Men's fashion has also changed over the course of the century, but not as much as women's fashion. Throughout the century, fashion was influenced by the times: war, politics, social movements, and more. Not only have women's clothing changed over the decades, but also hairstyles and fashion accessories (often accessories would be combined with hairstyles). Although not all 20th century fashion trends have been chic, they are all nostalgic time capsules today that many of us look back on with fond memories or look to the future with new resolutions. The following chronology highlights fashion trends from each decade to the 20th century. The fashion of the 1900s has changed a lot since the 18th century, the clothes and accessories looked very different from what they do today. Typical fashion of the time included corsets, stiff collars, and Gibson Girl hairstyles - a hairstyle with a bun based on ink drawings of women made by an American named Charles Gibson from the 1890s. Gibson's daughter was meant to personify the ideal American beauty of that time, and her hairstyle is soft and very poofy with a bun on top and ringlets and hanging tendrils. A fashion trend in the 1900s was the S-bend corset, it set the standard at the time and women all over the country wore this piece for many occasions. The corset pushed the hips backwards and forced the chest forward, creating a pouter-pigeon shape. The trend has been highlighted with puffy and frilly blouses adorned with elaborate decorations such as large ribbon ties and lace collars. Women's hair was often cut in the center and often curly around pads and fake hair to create an edge of hair around the hairline. 1910s At the turn of the century, fashion became more masculine and macho, but was also characterized by rich and exotic rocket trends. Women wore short bob haircuts throughout this decade, they also wore shorter skirts and dresses - much shorter for the short time as meant just above the ankle. The First World War strongly influenced much of the fashion of that time, designers created pieces that marked the generation and dressed women for the time. The hobbled skirt, for example, quickly caught up with the women of the time and remained at the height of fashion until the adages of about 1915. 1920s The 1920s are known as both the roaring 1920s and the era of jazz. This decade ushered in the modern era of women's fashion as it abandoned the more restrictive fashions of recent decades in favour of more comfortable clothing. Skirts and trousers offered the comfort that women sought. Athletic clothing, childlike silhouettes and shimmering opulence also characterize this famous era. The trend has increased both fashion declarations and women's independence. Women began to wear less constrictive clothing typical of the 1800s and early 1900s, opting instead for looser, breathable fabrics such as silk. Accessories have also made a great entrance in this decade, from matching headbands to beads Statement pieces: women were entering the forefront of the social framework with avant-garde clothing and confidence. 1930s Every decade of advancement has improved women's quality of life and their ability to self-expression. For example, fashion trends in the 1930s were strongly influenced by the progressive nature of the 1920s and reflect certain trends, but have taken the envelope further. Clothes more relaxed and comfortable, and for the first time, bolder than women not only wore less clothes, but more revealing clothes. Much of this fashion advancement came to a halt temporarily during the late decade when the Great Depression struck; this caused a retrograde in women's fashion back a decade before with more conservative clothing items highlighting traditional feminine characteristics. In it, longer hems returned to the scene and restrictive clothing that showed a woman's body appeared. 1940s Another decade marked and influenced by a world war featured women's fashion, and for clothing designers. The Second World War was in full swing, as was the fashion industry, with new fabrics and designs while losing other fabrics and designs. For example, common fabrics used in the 1920s, such as silk, were no longer used, instead, clothing was made from cheaper materials that were more available at the time. The war caused global trade shortages and deficits that slowed clothing production but spurred innovation in the industry. Colors were strongly influenced by the war, women adorned military-inspired fashion colors and badges such as navy and nautical colors. Women liked to show colors, and men appreciated the support and patriotism that this decade of fashion introduced. The war also produced more masculine clothing with even shorter skirts and stiffer, wider shoulders. 1950 Mid-century, fashion took a radical turn. The war had ended and a new decade with new confidence had begun. A feminine figure is celebrated in clothing and accessories models, with designers responding to new trends and requirements. The feminine shape took the spotlight with tight waists and high hems, a trend that set the tone for classic and timeless looks - until then. With the new cuts, came a new color, new designer bags from the 1950s, and models - experienced designers with multiple colors and different models to see what would work and what would sell. The new colours and patterns have made clothes less and less conservative with vibrant and repetitive floral patterns used to highlight a woman's beauty and physique. 1960s The 1960s saw progress in culture and human rights. Music has taken fashion on a groovy, and the civil rights movement in the United States has sparked greater independence in women's rights and fashion. This unique blend began a storm of fashion trends that broke many rules - many rules that had to be broken. The 1960s can be characterized as an era of social movements and fashion innovations that are still being worn today. These fashion trends reflected change in society and class structure, dividing some and joining others. Fashion has expressed these cultural and societal changes through clothing such as a-line dresses that showed women's legs and their extra height. The women wore clothes for practical purposes and for fashion statements, creating a decade of luxurious clothing such as silks and furs. Clothes and accessories were characterized by vibrant colors and puffy hair. Fashion in the 80s was characterized by unforgettable trends, some that are still worn today, but others that are not.
