The degree has been designed in cooperation with Lantra (<https://www.lantra.co.uk/>) in the field to ensure the relevance of the field. SVQs are based on national professional standards. SCQF level 5 horticulture SVQ is available through employers and training providers. After successful completion, learners will receive an international recognised qualification that guarantees that they have the necessary skills, knowledge and skills to successfully complete their tasks.
