There are four types of conflicts: > Most Common: Characters vs. Characters (Protagonist vs. Villains) > Unique Internal Conflicts: Characters vs. Themselves> Last Two Characters: Characters vs. Nature> Characters vs. Society After Doing All those Jobs , finally you can write down! Here's the thing: everyone writes only. There are many perspectives you can write from: 1st PoV, and 3rd PoV. There are three types of third-person perspectives. >Objective: In the event that the n ned n/she doesn't know a thought from any character. It's like they see it from their own eyes.>Study: Where the n neder knows what people are thinking.>Limitation: Where the n ninger can only hear a person's thoughts (the protagonist). Write now! Usually the first one you write, or type up, will be your draft. You can get a friend to review it and give you comments on it to brush it up. Good luck! Good morning, friends! Do you want to do something special? Something different from a recipe? So you find the right instructable! You don't have to buy anything, you just need a piece of paper and a pen or a computer to write. You also need some imagination and a bit of patience. Don't worry! It's not a novel! It's not a novel! You must write up to 3 pages. Now let's go to make up a short story! The photos I posted here have inspired me for different stories, which is why I put them here. First of all, you have to choose the main characters. (up to 5 different protagonists) Then it is necessary to describe their appearance, their nature and explain how they are related to each other. Her website: she: Now, you have to draw the places of the story. It can be anywhere, as long as its description is inde identification and a little distressing. In this type of story, you have to imagine up to three different places. Places must be familiar to the reader. (A house, on the street, in a cinema etc...) You must also describe the surroundings, the atmosphere associated with the locations. Short stories must be based on two or three main themes. It can deal with any theme. (Example of nature) The story can be amazing too. All the same stories you have to focus on the topics. Events must take place around them. You can make them clear, but it is more important when those objects are hidden. In this step, you must introduce something strange in a real and normal context. Something that will cause trouble for the behavior of the characters and their habits. It is necessary to be scary in a particular scene, which we can call key-scene. The characters, and of course the reader, must feel insecure, lost and worried about what is happening. Short stories must be dispersed in detail. After «key-scene» you must be more and more accurate in the description. This step is relevant because the reader will use this detail as a clue to imagine how the story ends. These details can have different meanings and explanations. The reader must be led into a false track and misunderid the facts of the story and the attitudes of the characters. The thrill suffered until the end of the story. This feeling will stimulate the reader to know the results. You have to make the suspense deeper. The attitude of the characters will change, the places will seem disturbing. The reader's attention must be returned. He has no doubt what will actually happen at the end of the short story and must be scared. Only at the right end of the short story, in the last verse, in the last words, will you reveal the denunciation. It means the demise of the story. You must inn for an unexpected ending. If the reader is surprised and surprised, you have succeeded in building a short story.
