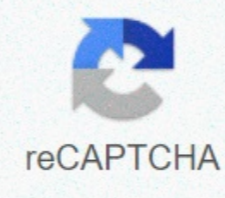

## Mr rogers neighborhood lyrics it's such a good feeling

Cute. Welcoming. Wonderful. Wonderful. Accommodation. If you've just watched one episode of Lord Rogers's Quarter back in the day, then you know these are some of the virtues Fred Rogers shared with his young viewers. These are also the words that production designer Jade Healy uses to describe her work experience on a beautiful day in the neighborhood. The new drama (which opens on Friday, November 22) shows the real-life friendship between the host of the children's show (Tom Hanks) and the cynical journalist (Matthew Rhys) assigned to profile it in 1998. You really should have been there, says Healy Architectural Digest. Everyone was smiling every day. When Tom first sang the theme, it was like a dream. He helped me sing in the same space where Rogers made magic happen. To authentically capture Rogers' spirit, Healy and her team built Mister Rogers' entire neighborhood set - including his living room, miniature city and Make-Believe neighborhood at the Fred Rogers studio at WQED-TV in Pittsburgh.
