It serves students in classes 9-12 in South Heidelberg Township, Heidelberg Township, North Heidelberg Township and Marion Township and the districts of Wernersville, Robesonia and Womelsdorf. [4] Eight properties in a residential development in West Cocalico in Lancaster County also attend high school. According to the National Center for Education Statistics, in 2010, Conrad Weiser High School reported enrolling 971 pupils in grades 9-12, with 257 pupils eligible for a federal free or reduced-price lunch due to family meeting the federal poverty level. The school is not a federally designated school of Title I. Conrad Weiser High School employed 69 teachers, which resulted in a 14:1 ratio of students and teachers. [5] According to a report from the Pennsylvania Department of Education, 12 classes were taught by teachers who were rated as non-highly qualified by No Child Left Behind. [6] Graduation rates Conrad Weiser's graduation rate fell to 86% in 2011. [7] In 2011, Conrad Weiser's graduation rate was 88%. In 2010, the Pennsylvania Department of Education issued a new, 4-year cohort. Conrad Weiser High School rate was 88% for 2010. [8] According to traditional calculations of graduation rate: 2010 - 94%[9] 2009 - 89% [10] 2008 - 92% [11] 2007 - 92% [12] High School In 2012, Conrad Weiser High School has fallen to the level of Remedial Measures I due to chronic, low student success in reading and math. [13] In 2011, Conrad Weiser High School was making progress in improving level II schools with lagging student success in reading and math. High school was in School Improvement Level II due to chronic, low student achievement. Students can transfer to another high school, if available. [14] PSSA results 11. The Science in Motion program was funded with state funds and cost the school nothing to participate in. [31] Ursinus College provides experience to schools in the region. According to a Pennsylvania Department of Education study released in January 2009, 38% of Conrad Weiser High School graduates required redress in math and/or reading before they were ready to take college courses in the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education or Community College. [32] Less than 66% of Pennsylvania high school graduates graduating to a four-year college in Pennsylvania receive a bachelor's degree within six years. Among Pennsylvania high school graduates, only one in three graduates in three years pursues an associate degree. [33] According to the Pennsylvania Department of Education, one in three recent high school graduates who attend Pennsylvania public universities and community colleges has at least one remedial course in math, reading or English. Graduation requirements Conrad Weiser area school board decided that students must get 27 credits per graduate, including: English 4 credits, social studies 4 credits, math and science total 3 per subject and 1 additional loan is either one, Gym 2 credits, Health 1 loan, arts and humanities 2 credits and 7 optional credits. [34] By law, all students of Pennsylvania high schools must complete the project as part of their eligibility to attend high school. The type of project, its consistency and expectations are determined by the individual school district. [35] Conrad Weiser High School requires students to complete a research document, oral presentation and portfolio/product. [36] In addition, students are required to have at least 20 hours of public service to obtain a diploma, and awards are awarded to students completing more than 100 hours of public service. [37] Under Pennsylvania School Board regulations, starting with class in 2017, public school students must successfully complete secondary course of work in Algebra I, biology and English literature by passing the Keystone exam. [38] [39] [40] For class 2019, a compositional test is added. For the 2020 year, the baccalaureate exam will be added to the baccalaureate requirements. [41] In 2011, Pennsylvania high school field students tested algebra I, biology and English Lit exams. Nationwide results were: Algebra I 38% at grade level, biology 35% at grade level and English Lit - 49% at grade level. [42] Individual student, school or district reports have not been made public, although they have been reported to district officials by the Pennsylvania Department of Education. Students identified as having special needs and qualifying for an individual education programme (IEP) can study the met requirements of their IEP. SAT scores In 2012, 169 Conrad Weiser School District students took SAT exams. The district's verbal average score was 473. The math average score was 492. The writing average score was 456. Nationwide Verbal SAT exam results were: Verbal 491, Mathematics 501, Writing 480. In the U.S., 1.65 million students took exams achieving an average score: Verbal 496, Math 514, Writing 488. According to the college board the maximum score on each section was 800, and 360 students nationwide scored a perfect 2,400 (800 in each section). In 2011, 164 Conrad Weiser School District students took SAT exams. The district's verbal average score was 490. The math average score was 491. The writing average score was 476. [43] Pennsylvania ranked 40th among states with sat scores: Verbal 493, Math 501, Writing 479. [44] In the United States, 1.65 million students took the exam in 2011. They averaged 497 (out of 800) verbally, 514 in math and 489 in writing. [45] Classrooms for the Future grant Classroom for the Future state program provided districts with hundreds of thousands of additional state funds to purchase laptops for each basic curriculum of the high school class (English, Science, History, Mathematics) and paid for teacher education to optimize computer use. The programme was financed from 2006 to 2009. The Conrad Weiser Area School District did not apply for attendance in 2006-07. In 2007-08, the district received \$304,902. The district received \$55,416 in 2008-09 for total funding of \$360,318. [46] In Berks County, the highest award was awarded to the Reading School District for \$1,294,497. The highest funding nationwide was awarded to the Philadelphia City School District in Philadelphia County - \$9,409,073. The grant program was discontinued by Governor Edward Rendell as part of the state budget 2009-10. Extracurricular activities Secondary School offers a wide range of clubs, arts and sports activities. Eligibility for participation is determined by the policy of the School Board. By law all K-12 students residing in the District, District, those attending private non-public school, cyber charter schools, charter schools and homeschooled ones are eligible to participate in extracurricular programs, including all athletics. They must comply with the same eligibility rules as students enrolled in district schools.
