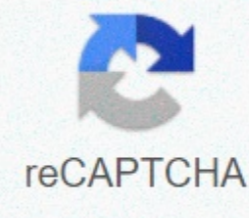




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## Swiftlock laminate flooring fireside oak

There are four basic components, or layers, of laminate flooring, each of which plays a specific role in the shape and durability of the floor. Here they are, bottom up: a support layer of plastic, paper or melamine, also known as the balance layer, works to stabilize the floor and resist moisture. Medium-density fiber panels (MDF) or HDF form the water-resistant substrate layer, or base layer. Both MDF and HDF are composed of wood fiber that is pressed together with adhesive and resin. The photograph, decorative or style layer gives the floor its realistic appearance. This layer is basically a photograph, and is usually built with multiple sheets of paper located with melamine resin. Realistic colors and shin pearl ink give the depth of the image and a realistic look. The pattern layer begins with one large picture of wood grains, which is divided into sections of the size of the desired sleigh board. Because the same image is used for many panels, it is possible to replicate patterns in the case of the panels. The protective top layer is the corrosion layer. It's usually built from a clear aluminum oxide coat. Paint can range from low gloss to high depending on consumer tastes. This layer prevents moisture penetration. These layers fall together and are melted using high heat and extreme pressure. Some panels have a thicker core than others, which affects overall durability - the thicker the product, the firmer the floor.
