## How to factory reset asus laptop from bios

One of the most useful features of modern devices, including the iPhone, is the ability to reset them in the factory. This deletes all custom information, settings, photos, and apps for your device and sets the default factory status. You usually do this when you're about to sell or recycle your phone, or if you're trying to fix a serious problem. The whole process takes several minutes, although in certain circumstances it may take longer. Before you reset your iPhone to factory settings, you should know what the risk of doing it. Many iPhones have default settings that require a unique unlock code after resetting, which locks many people from their phones. But there are ways to do this. Also, if you don't have a backup, you might lose all photos, videos, apps, and documents you can store on your phone. Make sure you have the latest version of iTunes or you may not be able to reset your phone. You can update iTunes on your Mac computer by opening it and clicking the Apple menu. From there, select System Preferences, and then click Software Update. To do this on your computer, select Help from the menu bar at the top of the iTunes window. To do this with iCloud, make sure you've connected your device to a Wi-Fi network. Go to Settings and click your name. Select iCloud from this menu, and then select iCloud Backup. Then just tap the Backup button now. To use an iTunes backup, connect your phone to your computer with a USB cable. When iTunes finds your device, go to the device icon in the upper-left corner. This icon opens the device menu and you can select your phone. On the left-hand menu page, search for the Backup section. To protect your password backup, select the Encrypt iPhone backup check box, and then leave it unchecked. Click the Back Now Backup button. To prevent theft, Apple requires a separate unlock code after the phone is reset. Most people set it up when they get their phone and forget about it. When they try to reset their phone, they become locked, and there is little to can do to solve this problem. To turn off Find my iPhone, go to the settings menu. From there, tap your name and iCloud. After that, iTunes should detect that you have a device in recovery mode and a pop-up window will appear. If you have enabled iCloud and Find My iPhone on your device, you can travel to the iCloud website or find my iPhone on another device that shares the same Apple ID account. You can restore your laptop to factory settings with or without drives to improve performance and performance. Because operating system versions differ between laptops, check the product documentation for the exact laptop recovery procedure. Before you restore all factory settings, be sure to back up all the data elsewhere except your laptop, because playback will reformat your hard disk by deleting all previous memory. Open the CD-ROM drive and insert the recovery disc into it. Click Start, and then select Restart. The System Restore Wizard will appear. Follow the instructions in the Recovery Wizard. Select Format partition using the NTFS file system. This will format the hard disk and erase all previous memory. Restart your laptop after recovery is complete. Restart your computer by clicking Start and selecting Restart. When the notebook logo appears, press the appropriate function key. Depending on the model, it should be Ctrl+F11, F8, or F1. Step 1: Prepare your iPhone by backing up your first Apple iCloud, which is turned on by default when you sign in with your Apple ID. To decide what backups you want, go to Settings > [Your name] > iCloud or go to Settings > iCloud in some older versions of iOS and switch between the items you want to back up. We recommend that you choose to back up almost everything, but especially photos, mail, contacts, and notes, because factory reset will clear the lot. After switching between selections, scroll down and tap iCloud Backup, then turn on (if it's not yet) and tap Backup Up Now. How to reset iPhone using iTunes (old way) Perform factory settings on iPhone – whether it be or iPhone 11 Pro Max – easier when you use iCloud and reset directly from your device, but you can still use Apple's aging iTunes with your computer. This is useful if you have traditionally used this method and you are a long-time owner of the iPhone. Apple has retired iTunes for MacOS, so if you using MacOS Catalina or later, syncing on Mac computers will be handled through Finder. You'll find your connected iPhone on the Devices or Locations tab. The layout is much the same as your iPhone tab in iTunes, so these instructions should work well. You can also still use iTunes on Windows computers or older Macs. Step 1: Prepare for iPhone recovery First start iTunes as usual. If you're using a Mac, click the iTunes menu on the left side of the main toolbar, or, if you're using Windows, click the Help menu on the right. Select Check for updates from the drop-down menu, and make sure you have the latest version of iTunes. If not, download and install the latest version. Manual settings will disappear, of course, but you'll still have photos, apps, and other content. Delete all content and settings This is an option we described at the beginning of this post that deletes everything from your device. Your settings, pictures, apps, and other data will disappear unless you back up the content. Reset network settings Sometimes you just need to update your network settings to set up a better connection. This option resets network settings, clears the cache, and deletes all temporary files that you store on your device. This is great for those who experience problems with different Wi-Fi connections. Reset keyboard dictionary Sometimes AutoCorrect can do more harm than good. If you think your iPhone always offers spelling mistakes and misspellings based on previous messages, you can always reset your keyboard dictionary. Reset the main screen layout Although most people like to set their smartphone's home screen with their favorite apps, sometimes it's nice to change things a little. If you ever want to return to the original home screen layout that's provided with your phone, you can choose this reset option. Reset location and privacy Sometimes when you start tapping in settings, you can mess it up. If you want to return to your phone's original privacy and location settings, this is a reset.
