## Raffle license application michigan

Applications for a RaffleA qualified organization wishing to sell lottery tickets can apply for a Raffle License. For drawing date allocation no more than \$500 in prizes, the cost is \$15 for up to three drawing dates and \$5 for each additional date. In order to award an unlimited amount in prizes, the license will cost \$50 per subscription date. Print and post along with the appropriate fee. RAFFLE license application CANCEL OR REBOOK A RAFFLE To cancel a raffle, notify our office in writing, contact all ticket buyers, and give a refund. If you have sold tickets and the lottery draw is postponed, please notify our office in writing with a new date. If you are not familiar with the new date, please state in your notification that you will contact us in writing when you have a new date. Then contact all ticket buyers to offer a refund or inform them that their ticket will still apply to the new drawing. If you plan to sell more tickets, you'll need to correct the drawing date on your tickets. Many non-profit groups hold bingo games and lotteries to raise money to support their philanthropic missions. The state of Michigan, like many other states, classifies lotteries and other charity contests as games of chance. As such, lotteries are subject to state regulation. Anyone who wants to hold a lottery in Michigan must file an application and get a license. Under Michigan Charitable Gaming Act Rule R 4321101, a lottery is all events where tickets are sold with the winner collecting a prize, or where the winners are selected through a drawing of ticket stumps. Read More: Is Selling Raffle Tickets for Profit Legal? Michigan only allows certain charities to conduct lotteries and these charities must be licensed. Michigan Charitable Gaming Act Rule R 432.21202 quantifies a bona-fide charity as one that is registered with the state and meets all government qualifications for nonprofit sensitizes. A large-lottery license is needed if the total value of all prizes awarded will exceed \$500 in a single day. As of June 2011, the license will cost \$50.00 per subscription date. A small lottery license is required if the prizes awarded in all drawings will not exceed \$500.00. The organization can offer multiple drawings as long as the sum of the drawings does not exceed the threshold. The license fee as of June 2011 is \$15.00 for up to three dates and \$5.00 for each date thereafter. Michigan law allows qualified charities to hold the lottery without a license as long as the lottery is a single event, there are no sold tickets and the gross amount of prizes does not exceed \$100.00 So your organization is considering implementing RAFFLES.... Here are some of the requirements that must be met under Wisconsin law, that these are not inclusive; refer to the links below for the statutes, brochure and application material application material complete information. Qualified OrganizationsAny local religious, charitable, service, fraternal or veterans organization or any organization to which grants are deductible for federal income tax purposes or state income or franchise tax purposes, which have been in place for one (1) year immediately prior to their application for a license or which is chartered by a state or national organization that has existed for at least three (3) years, may conduct a prize draw on receipt of a license for the lottery event from the Department. No other person may make a lottery in this state. Local organisationAn organisation whose activities are limited to this state, to a specific geographical area within that state or to a specific geographical area which is partly within that state and partly within another State. An example of partly within this state and partly within another state would be Beloit, WI and South Beloit, IL or Superior, WI and Duluth, MN or other Wisconsin municipalities bridging state lines. State statutes require organizations to exist for at least one year immediately prior to their application or belong to a state or national organization that has existed for at least three years. Ch. 563.90, Wis. Stats. Organization type: Religious:An established religious institution or group thereof. If not, additional background information is requested. Veteran: An established group of former participants in the United States Armed Forces. If not, additional information is requested. Fraternal: An organization with a representative form of government that (1) operates under the lodge system with a ritualistic form of work; (2) is organised to promote the payment of life, illness, accident or other insurance benefits to its members; or (3) is organized to conduct any worthy civic or service purpose. Service: An organisation that, as a minimum, has the benefit, growth and general welfare of society as one of its principled purposes. This category includes a work organisation whose jurisdiction is limited to a specific geographical area within the state or political party, except a state committee registered under S. 11.05 and organised exclusively for political purposes under whose name candidates appear on a ballot in elections. This also excludes a trade association or a social club. Charitable: An organisation will be classed as such if the dominant purpose of its work is for the public good, and the work done for its members is but the means adopted for this purpose. Include registration certificates issued from the state of Wisconsin. 501(c)(3):Internal Revenue Service letter of determination that contributions to your organization are deductible for income tax purposes. Class Aaffle is the license type needed when tickets are only sold on the day of the draw. Generic lottery tickets may be used. A winner must be present to win. Click here for more information on implementing a Class B lottery. An organisation carrying out both Class A and Class B draws must obtain both types of licence. You must submit a separate application, supporting documentation (Articles of Incorporation, Constitution, Charter or By-Laws) and a fee for each license. All winnings from lotteries must be consumed in a manner consistent with the articles of the company, constitution, statute or statutes of the organisation.
