The headphone test is located in the TestNav app under the Practical Tests link. Telpas Reading Tests Telpas Reading Tests contain sampling of reading passages and test questions. The purpose of practical tests is to introduce students to the online interface, available tools and types of test elements. Practical tests should not be used to assess students' level of proficiency. To generate a points report, the student must submit their final answers. Telpas Reading Released Tests THEA provides Telpas reading tests released in the online interface used for the spring application. Districts can administer these tests to students for diagnostic purposes. TestNav 8 does not generate a test summary. If you want to mark your student's practice test, you should direct your student to write their answers on a separate piece of paper. You can then use the answer key below to get an assessment of the practice test. To determine the student's proficiency, use the appropriate telpas reading results conversion table available on the TEA website to NOTE: Students must complete the tests in one sitting. The student's answers cannot be recorded to resume later. The Texas Education Agency has adopted final rules including several major changes to the 2016 test security supplement, including a

clarification that students can stay in after completing their exam, as well as requirements for visiting students who refuse to pass the test. The rules have been in force since 15 March 2016 and include administrative acts for 2016, according to the TAA. The first change concerns the assessment of the student's response document. To clarify the existing policy, the 2016 security supplement specifies that students who are in class 3-8 or for the first time assess the end of the course who are in the presence of the tests but choose not to participate or refuse to score their answers in the response document or online form will have their assessment tests as it is, which is presented at the end of the student's test session, is considered burnt. The districts shall be responsible for enabling all eligible students who are in the presence of an exam during an assessment to participate in the test and for an appropriate assessment of each response document. When adopting the 2016 test security supplement, it was amended to clarify the requirement to evaluate students for the first time. The second policy change applies to the English-language assessment training calibration system (TELPAS). In Test Security Supplement 2016, THEA stated that calibration must be carried out in a proctoral environment. The 2016 Security Supplement Test also directs the areas to make the necessary facilities to conduct calibration activities. The Appendix provides that the receipt or provision of unauthorised aid during telpas calibration activities constitutes a serious irregularity in testing. Third, in response to district staff's requests for additional flexibility while allowing the visualization of the State of Texas Academic Readiness Assessments (STAAR) Alternative 2 protective test material to help prepare accommodation, trained test administrators will be allowed to store the materials that are in possession of the tests throughout the day while protected materials are stored in a locked repository, when not in use. All materials still need to be checked back to the college coordinator at the end of the day and district and campus staff are required to verify compliance with these procedures. The fourth amendment refers to the requirement for a state assessment calculator, which allows districts to provide either a portable calculator or a calculator application available on a tablet. The 2016 security test add-on states that the Internet capabilities of a calculator or device that has a calculator app must be disabled. Devices must also be locked (in kiosk mode) to prevent other applications from being used during testing. Finally, THEA clarifies the policies for verifying the destruction of materials. Areas will be instructed to check that procedures are in place for the collection and of all reference materials, records, millimeter paper or scratch provided by the State on which students have written during a test. In response to public comment, the UAE revised the language from the proposed 2016 test security supplement, which requires neighborhoods to exempt students from the test area after they have completed and submitted their assessment tests. Upon admission, the 2016 test security supplement states that it can be determined on the spot whether, after the student has completed and submitted a test, the student can quietly read a book or be allowed to leave the testing area.
