Campers will practice the basic technique of brush painting to draw their favorite animals such as goldfish and rats since 2020 is rat year. They will also learn/practice the basic calligraphy technique for writing Chinese characters. Chinese 题 idioms are mainly derived from historical facts or ancient Chinese literature. As a result, they are often intimately linked to an interesting story. Many of these stories are fun and educational. My husband and I sent our 2 children to Oregon Hope Chinese School to so we've known the head teacher, Min Kong, for a very long time. She became like an extended family to us. Our eldest daughter attended her first kindergarten here when she was 3 years old. She wasn't the easiest kid to do and I still remember she was a little careful to go to school for the first time. Ms. Kong was very patient and understanding and helped her (and we, the parents) facilitate the transition. Now it's our youngest son's turn to go to kindergarten. He too was a little cautious during the first few months, but both gradually enjoy spending time at school. They made good friends, learned a ton of Chinese (which is our main reason to choose school), learned discipline, respect, but also fun. When I pick up the two children from school, they all have a smile on their faces. I still remember with my daughter, she actually begged me to stay longer so she could play more with her friends. The school has a good size playground filled with many play structures. I like their small student-teacher ratio, so everyone gets enough attention in the classroom. Ms. Kong creates a monthly theme for children, for example this month they learn about the solar system, the previous months they were learning modes of transportation, weather, farm life. They also learn and celebrate Chinese and American holidays: Chinese New Year, Mooncake Festival, Thanksgiving, Christmas. They would bring home some very beautiful artistic projects and I would collect them as souvenirs. All teachers speak to them entirely in Chinese Mandarin so that they can resume the language more quickly. All in all, my husband and I are very happy to have found a good and safe Chinese immersion preschool for our children.
