We serve a diverse student population including newcomers and special day students, and offer Spanish immersion teaching and unique enrichment in arts, leadership and political activism. Everett's school vision is that students leave 8th grade above or above class level and have the power to change the world. To achieve this, we offer an inclusive school model where, regardless of whether a student is an English student or has an IEP, they are challenged, supported, and celebrated in the general education class. We believe that this inclusive model helps students build relationships across the board, which are vital to becoming effective agents of change. We also strive to cultivate strong academic identities among our students. We do this by using standards based on graduation and giving students frequent information about their progress. We also offer small group intervention classes for students who come to Everett below grade level in reading or math. These are available from 14:45 to 15:24 from Monday to Thursday. If a student does not qualify for these classes, they are able to attend school from 8:30 to 2:45 p.m. instead of 8:30 a.m. to 3:24 p.m. Everett has a block program where students have three 90-minute blocks of academic teaching, and a block for PE and selection. The academic courses offered daily are mathematics, English language and non-fiction arts (scientific/social studies). Students on the Spanish dual language route receive their studies in non-fiction studies in Spanish. In 2018-2019 we offer band, orchestra, vocal music, theatrical arts, peer resources, computer science and art for selection courses. Everett is also proud to offer a newcomer pathway for students to develop their English skills before bridging into a full general education program.
