Popular activities here include hiking, cycling, touring the 11-mile Cads Cove Loop Road and Wildlife Watch. Whether blankets in bright spring wildflowers or bright autumn colors, the scenery in Cades Cove never disappoints. Cades Cove is a wide, gentle valley surrounded by mountains and one of the most popular spots in the Great Smoky. It offers some of the best opportunities to view wildlife in the park. You can often see a large number of white-tailed deer, as well as see black bear, coyote, groundhog, turkey, raccoon, skunk and other animals. For hundreds of years, Cherokee Indians hunted in The Bay oflides, but archaeologists have found no evidence of large settlements. The first Europeans settled in the bay sometime between 1818 and 1821. By 1830, the population of the region had already increased to 271. Cades Cove Campground is open all year round and combines the feeling of primitive camping with the modern convenience of toilets and drinking water. During the peak season (May - October) the camp shop provides visitors with basic necessities as well as bicycle rental. Activities such as Interpretive Programs in the nearby amphitheatre and bike-only days on the loop of the road provide visitors with a fun and unique experience. In the off-season (November-April) camping is a walk, except for the C38-C61 sites that are available for reservations in advance. All campsites drive up and allow no more than two vehicles. Each camping allows no more than six people and tents must be on tents; plan accordingly. Only one RV or trailer is allowed on RV websites. Any RV, including motorhomes, cabin campers and campers, or any trailer including 5th wheels, pop-up campers, as well as cargo or boat trailer vehicles and count to the limit. Each camping site has overflow parking for redundant vehicles. Each camping allows no more than six people and tents must be on tents; plan accordingly. Hammocks are allowed, but limited trail camping. Check-out time at 12:00.m Park the entire camping limit of 14 nights, per visit does not exceed 60 days per year. These restrictions apply to all park campsites. Silent hours from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. quiet hours from 8:00 p.m.-8:00 p.m.-8:00 There are no connections or showers at the campsite. Cades Cove Campground Kiosk has an emergency phone. Hammocks are allowed in camping with the following guidelines: Must be on the trail of camping, limited to trees 10 inches in diameter with adequate upholoration around the tree and only 2 hammocks can be suspended from the same tree. Camping \$25 per night for individual campsites. Camping reservations at Cades Cove Campground can be made 6 months before your arrival date online by calling www.recreation.gov or calling 877-444-6777. Owners of the Interagency Senior/Golden Age or Interagency Access/Access Pass receive a 50% discount on individual campsites. There is no discount on group sites. There is no discount on camping fees for an interagency annual pass (\$80 pass). Pets are allowed on a leash no more than six feet. Walking in the park with pets is only allowed on the roads, oconaluttee River Trail and Gatlinburg Trail. Food, camping supplies, food and firewood Limited selection of food, camping, visitor amenities, and food and beverages are available in the park. Please see the list for more information. Certified firewood kits are available for sale in the communities surrounding the national park. The wood can't be delivered to the park if it carries a USDA-APHIS-PP or state certification that it has been heat-treated. The following campsites have on-site sale firewood: Cades Cove (in the Cades Cove Campground Store) Elkmont Smokemont (in Smokemont Riding Stables) Late arrival park camping procedures are not closed. You can register within a few hours. However, please be careful with your neighbors when setting up the camp, keeping the noise and light to a minimum. Silent hours from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. If you forget your designated site, check the arrival list posted on the bulletin board at the kiosk, in your name and website number. Pre-booking If you arrive after the camping is closed, please go to the designated site. If you forget your designated site, check the late arrival list on the bulletin board, your name and website number. Return to the camping office the next morning to check in. If you don't check in, you can reassign it and your booking may be cancelled. If you don't have any pre-bookings, check the late arrival list. If there are campsites available to campers who do not have reservations, these available sites will be placed on the list. Set up only on one of the sites listed as available. All other sites are designated to tourists with reservations. Return to the office the next morning to register. Registration time 2:00pm Natural FeaturesCove sits along the river and is one of the closest camping to the Eleven Mile Reservoir, which covers 3,405 acres of surface and 5 miles in length. Eleven Mile Canyon was cut down by the South Platt River and bordered by polished gray granite cliffs.
