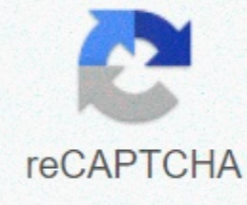

Location: Kanawaoha County, West Virginia: 180,454 (2018 data) Food Policy Category: Food Security; Diet and Nutrition Program Goals: To Ensure Children Are Fed Throughout the Summer Months How It Works: Kanawa County Schools Are Part of the Federally Funded Summer Food Service Program. Starting June 8, Kanawha schools will offer free summer meal kits to all children aged 18 and under who wish to participate, whether or not they are enrolled in a public school in Kanaoha Province. The program will run until August 4. Families will be able to receive their meal supplies at any of the 19 schools in the district on Monday or Tuesday, depending on the schedule of the site. Upon arrival at the school, recipients will be required to drive to the check-in point and open their box or side door. Staff Wearing masks will load meals in the car and close the door. This protocol will reduce the amount of physical contact required to distribute and receive meals in order to avoid any spread of COVID-19. Meal packages include five breakfasts and five lunches, as well as milk. Some items included in meals will require refrigeration within two hours and will be marked accordingly. All meals have a validity of 10 days. Progress so far: In previous years, schools have provided on-site meals, and students have been able to have breakfast and/or lunch together at the distribution site. Because of COVID-19, this will be the first year that meals are distributed for off-site consumption. This summer's meal set distribution program will begin June 8th. Why it matters: According to provincial health classifications for 2020, 26 per cent of children in Kanaoha province live in poverty and 14 per cent of the entire population is food insecure. Because of the epidemic, about 10,000 provincial residents have filed new unemployment claims in recent months, and unemployment rates have risen from 5.5 percent in March to 17.8 percent in April. Many children eat breakfast and lunch at school because their families are unable to afford or provide adequate food and nutrition at home. When schools were closed in March due to COVID-19, many school systems including Kanawaha County continued to provide meals to students by pick-up or bus delivery. During the last week of bus delivery, Kanaoha Province provided 112,500 meals. We know that a lot of families depend on these meals and we were happy to serve them as if the children were in school, said spokeswoman Brianna Warner. So this summer, every summer, no less needed. Kanawa County schools recently announced their sponsorship of the 2020 federally funded Summer Food Service Program, which includes five-day breakfast and lunch boxes available to all children aged 18 and under. Diane Miller, Baby The Director of Kanawa County Schools (KCS) said this is a parent-only pick-up program, different from the delivery of school buses that were conducted at the end of the school year. There will be no contact at all, Miller said of the operation at the sites. There will be someone asking how many meal groups are required. The next person will have an open trunk or ask if he can open the side door to put meals in the car. There are 20 locations in schools across the county that will have packages of meal packages. KCS said participation will vary in each location and schedules can be adjusted to accommodate the needs of the region. Five-day meal packages will include breakfast and lunch items along with milk. They have a shelf life of 10 days and parts of several will need to cool down within 2 hours. They will be exactly the same at the conclusion of our nutrition program during the school year. In fact, it's the same company and milk will be included, Miller said about meals. Miller expects to serve about 50,000 meals a week during the summer, up from 135,000 a week during the school year. It still expects the sites to be crowded and welcomes all volunteers to help make the process faster. Many location captures will move to Tuesdays the week after the primaries.
