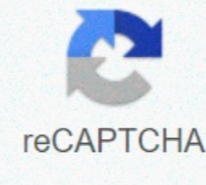




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## Ravenna school district

ALL APPLICATION for November 29 – Remote Learning, Technology Support and Food Distribution: Hello, this Dennis Honkala, Superintendent of Ravenna Schools with some very important messages for all Ravenna Families. First, a reminder that all teachers and students have switched to distance learning until at least December 18. After the Christmas holidays we will re-evaluate the safety realities for staff and students and decide whether we will continue with full distance learning or have an option in person learning. All students are responsible for the school day schedule and all families are reminded that we continue to follow the school year calendar. There is no school tomorrow, November 30, but all classes will resume from Tuesday, December 1 to December 18. Our technology support team will also be available every Tuesday and Thursday from 11:00 to 13:00 at Ravenna High School for repair or exchange of chrome cards. If your child does not have internet access, please call the building manager and they will be able to help you with this. And finally, we continue to have food distribution available to all Ravenna students every Tuesday for the next three weeks. Any Ravenna student can receive 5 bags of food, plus two bags of birds every Tuesday. Tuesday's distributions are at Ravenna High School, 2:45 - 3:45 pm, Brown Middle School, 3:30 - 4:30 pm, West Main and Willing elementary schools from 4:00 to 5:00. All call for November 22 – RSD transition to full distance learning on November 24 and plan for the next 4 weeks of food distribution: Hello, this is Dennis Honkala, Superintendent of Ravenna School District with some very important messages for all Ravenna families. First, so we notified all families Friday, we are switching to all distance learning starting Tuesday, November 24, through at least December 18. The safety of our students and staff is our number one priority. Unfortunately, due to mandatory quarantine on the Portage County Health Department, we do not have the required number of staff every day to properly and safely supervise and educate our students. We will reassess our situation during the Christmas holidays. All students in person should come to school tomorrow, Monday, November 23 rd wrong for a full day. Students will bring home a Chromebook and any other materials needed to continue their education. Secondly, for the next 4 weeks, from Tuesday, November 24, we will have food distribution once a week for all Ravenna students. I repeat, once a week, on Tuesday, for the next 4 weeks, we will have food distribution for all students of the Raven, the ravine, distributions will be on Tuesdays only at Ravenna High School, Brown Middle School, Willyard Elementary and West Main Elementary. It's okay to go to the school that's closest to your house. Every Tuesday afternoon, students will receive 5 days of food from the county. Tuesday afternoon pick up times are: Ravenna High School, 2:45 - 3:45 pm, Brown Middle School, 3:30 - 4:30 pm, Willyard Elementary 4:00 - 5:00 pm and West Main Elementary 4:00 - 5:00 pm. This information will be posted on our Facebook pages and district website. And, as always, please continue to follow the district's website and Facebook pages to keep up with any information as we continue through the next few weeks heading towards the Christmas break. Have a nice afternoon. Ravenna School District is organized into six school buildings where students from the same classes at the district level enjoy learning together starting from kindergarten – building strong bonds of friendship that grow and build year after year. Our 5-star kindergarten (SUTQ) shares the space with the central offices and special services in the Carlin building. West Park is our kindergarten building, Willyard is the first and second-class house. West Main is home to all third- and fourth graders. All students in grades 5-8 attend Brown Middle School, and Ravenna High School is home to our students 9-12. These pages are invaluable resources for details about classwork, events, and activities that take place in all grades and facilities. Ravenna School District is one of the largest school districts in Portage County, with over 2,200 students in pre-K grades up to 12. The district serves students through a pre-school program, three elementary schools, a middle school and a high school, which are equipped with nearly 185 certified staff members. Maintenance and custody staff, secretaries, food service employees, transport staff and training assistants are part of our support staff. Ravenna is located in southern Portage County, about an hour southeast of Cleveland and 30 minutes northeast of Akron. Located in the county seat, Ravenna is convenient for numerous government and community agencies that serve our families. Our academic programming follows academic content standards in Ohio. Students with special needs, including those with disabilities and those identified for the talented and talented program, are provided with specialized training. All students in elementary buildings receive instruction in art, music and physical education. Middle and high school students also have access to these classes, in addition to other explorers and options. The high school offers AP honors and classes, as well as post-secondary options. extracurricular and athletic options are available to help provide well-rounded experiences in our schools.
