It is located 50 km northwest of Miami. The Weston review established itself as a city on September 3, 1996. [6] Much of the community was developed by Arvida/JMB Realty (known for developing Walt Disney World) and located near the western development boundaries of Broward County. [citation needed] It's the westernmist city in Broward County, and its entire west side is next to the Everglades. [7] Since the 2010 census, the city has had a total of 65,333 inhabitants. [6] Weston is the capital of the Miami metropolitan area, home to an estimated 6,012,331 people at the 2015 census. In 2010 Money magazine ranked Weston 19th [8] In 2006 he was ranked as the city with the most job growth in Florida and 18th [9] BusinessWeek ranked Weston as one of the best available suburbs in the United States in November 2006. [10] [11] Weston consistently ranks highly annually in CNN Money's Biggest Income category. In 2008, Money magazine ranked Weston at 73. [12] In 2012, Weston moved eleven slots to 62. [13] Recently, Family Circle Magazine named it one of the top ten places for families in 2015. [14] In February 2018, Weston ranked #8 in the Top 100 Safest Places in the U.S. by NeighborhoodScout. [15] Climate Weston has a tropical rainforest climate (Af). Winters are usually dry and warm during La Niña conditions, while El Niño conditions usually bring cold and wet conditions to the region. The effects of ENSO on Florida is relatively minimal in the summer months, with the exception of tropical cyclone activity in the Atlantic Ocean. [16] Geography Weston is located at 26°6′27″ north, 80°23′17″ west﻿ / ﻿26.107534, −80.388151,[17] on the western edge of the Broward County development. In 2000, there were 16 576 households, of which 51.3 % had children under the age of 18, 71.0 % lived together, 9.0 % had a household without a spouse and 17.6 % were non-members. 13.8% of all households were individuals and 3.3% had someone who lived alone and was 65 years of age or older. The average household size was 2.97 and the average family size was 3.29. In 2000, the age distribution of the city was as follows: 32.4% were under the age of 18, 5.0% from 18 to 24 years, 36.1% from 25 to 44, 19.8% from 45 to 64 years and 6.7% to 65 years of age or older. The median age was 34 years. For every 100 females, there were 94.1 males. For every 100 women aged 18 and over, there were 90.2 men. In 2000, English was the only language spoken at home by 62.5% of the population, while Spanish speakers made up 31.40% of the population, Portuguese speakers made up 1.3% of the population and French speakers 0.82%. [19] Since 2010 Weston had the highest number and highest percentage of Venezuelans in the United States, at 9.4% of the city's population,[20] the 14th highest percentage of Colombian population in the U.S., at 6.19% of the city's population,[21] the seventy-fifth highest percentage of Cubans, at 4.05% of weston's population,[22] and had the forty-seventh highest share Peruvians in the U.S., with 1.19% of the population (tied with Orange, New Jersey.) [23] Also, Puerto Ricans (who were born U.S. citizens) make up 4.1% of the population. [24] Economy Estimated in 2010, the median household income in the city was \$93,553 [25] and the median per capita income was \$40,432. [26] Men had a median income of \$63,135 versus \$38,119 for women. 2.3% of the population was below the poverty line. Of the total population, 0.8% of people under the age of 18 and 8.2% of 65 and older lived below the poverty line. The American InterContinental University South Florida Campus is located in Weston. Broward College has a small campus on the second floor of the Broward County Public Library-Weston Branch. Charter School Imagine Charter School at Weston Sports City contracts with Weston Sports Alliance, Inc., Weston owns all volunteer organizations to manage its organized athletics leagues. The alliance is made up of six charter organizations, baseball/softball/t-ball, basketball, soccer, soccer, lacrosse and rugby, with more than 9,000 participants each year. [39] October 16-18, 2013, Weston hosted the World Hardcourt Bike Polo Championship. Weston currently has an agreement with the American Youth Soccer Organization (AYSO) on the use of regional soccer pitches. Football has become a very popular sport in this area where FUTSOC has brought international football recognition his Number 1 national ranking in 2015, which was honored with a recognition certificate from the city of Weston. [40] Weston FC has also grown into one of the largest and most respected competitive football clubs in the nation, even fielding a semi-pro Premier Development League team. Home for the Weston Hawks and Weston Rattlers travel baseball team and Weston Warriors football and lacrosse teams. Weston also has the largest rugby club in Florida, Okapi Wanderers Rugby FC, which trains and plays at Tequesta Trace Park. Weston is also home to several golf facilities, Weston Hills Country Club with two 18-hole courses, and Bonaventure Country Club with an 18-hole golf course. Weston Parks has many parks. In addition, Markham Park, a large County Park located in Sunrise north of the city. Sawgrass Leisure Park is located in the Everglades, north of the city on the U.S. 27th 8,000-year-old Paleo-Indian and Tequesta Indian Burial Hill located in the city. [41] Country Isles Park A four-acre park is located near the Weston Town Center. This park includes a shaded playground, gazebo, exercise track and is dog friendly. [42] Eagle Point Park Adjacent to Eagle Point Elementary School, this seven-a-level park features two baseball fields, a sand volleyball court, a shaded playground, an exercise track, and a lakefront area. [43] Emerald Estates Park Five-acre park featuring shaded playgrounds, basketball courts, tennis courts, two picnic shelters with barbecues, an exercise track, fitness stations, waterfront views, and being dog friendly. [44] Gator Run Park Gator Run Park is located next to Gator Run Primary School. It's a 7-acre community park with one shaded playground and three pavilions. [45] Adjacent to Country Islands Elementary School, this 5.25 ar park includes two baseball fields and a soccer field. [46] Indian Trace Park A five-acre neighborhood park featuring a baseball field, shaded playground, soccer/football field, basketball court, and dog friendly. This park is adjacent to trace indian primary school. [47] Weston Library Park Located opposite Cypress Bay High School, this five aberries park serves as a bridge between Cypress Bay High School and The Weston Library. The park provides an outdoor classroom/local collection area with its three gazebos. The fountain near the entrance has several benches around it; builders designed for it to be a quiet reading of the park. Bronze plaques are scattered around the park on two information walks called Ring of Florida Authors and Walk of Discovery. [48] Peace Mound Park Peace Mound Park[49] is an 8.16-hectare park located on Indian Trace Road and Three Village Road, located behind La Morada. The park includes a shaded playground, bike path, fishing dock, two small picnic shelters with a table, dog friendly and Settings. The park was built around the burial ground of Tequesta Trace. Bronze plaques surround the park and explain the history of the place. [50] Tequesta Trace Park Tequesta Trace Park is adjacent to Tequesta Trace High School. It has 42 acres of community park, four baseball fields, a shaded playground, one ice rink and a major football field with a track followed by a sidewalk. [51] Home of FUTSOC, Weston Rattlers, Weston Warriors and Okapi Wanderers Rugby FC. [39] Weston Town Center Park This 6-acre linear park has an outdoor amphitheatre that hosts many local concerts and events. The park stretches across the surrounding canal and creates a waterway. Vista Park Vista Park Hotel is located next to Cypress Bay High School and Falcon Cove High School. It has 30 acres of community park, four baseball/softball fields and four football fields. [53] Weston Regional Park Weston Regional Park is a 102-acre park, consisting of the Weston Family YMCA together with swimming pools, eight baseball pitches, eight football/football pitches, eight basketball courts, two roller ski ice rinks, one Astroturf ice rink, skate park, two shaded playgrounds, three sand volleyball courts, an event stage, three picnic shelters with barbecues and hiking trails. The park was first opened in 2000. It's home to the Weston Hawks. [54] Windmill Ranch Park adjacent to Everglades Elementary School, this park provides a shaded playground and one football/football field for schools and locals. [55] Weston Town Center Weston Town Center is a shopping mall located on the corner of Royal Palm Boulevard and Bonaventure Boulevard. It offers salons and boutiques such as Weston jewellers and Via Moda. It also provides casual and luxurious dining options for its visitors such as Graziano, Cheesy Curve and Prime Time. [56] The initial construction of the Weston Town Center began in November 1999. The 32-acre (13-hectare) project cost \$42 million. [57] In addition to boutique and catering, this city centre has a bell tower, Weston Town Center Park (1.2 miles long lake hugging park) and an outdoor amphitheatre for organizing city events. In 2011, the city approved plans to expand the Northwest Retail Center to accommodate the new emergency care facility, which is now a Baptist emergency care facility.
