## Milton joseph parsons

Parsons is best known for playing Sheldon Cooper in the CBS sitcom The Big Bang Theory (2007-2019). [2] [3] He received several awards for his performance, including four Primetime Emmy Awards for Outstanding Lead Actor in a Comedy Series[5] and the Golden Globe Award for Best Actor in a Musical or Comedy Series. In 2018, Forbes estimated his annual salary at \$26.5 million and named him the highest-paid television actor in the world. Parsons made his Broadway debut in 2011 portraying Tommy Boatwright in The Normal Heart, for which he shared a Drama Desk Award for outstanding performance. He reprised the role in the film adaptation of the play, and received his seventh Emmy nomination, this time in the category of Outstanding Supporting Actor in a Miniseries or Movie. Similarly, Parsons played the role of host michael in the Broadway production of the 50th anniversary of The Boys in the Band, which won the 2019 Tony Award for Best Cover of a Play, reprised his performance (with the entire Broadway anniversary cast) in the 2020 film adaptation. In film, Parsons has cast the lead role in Home (2015) and played supporting roles in Hidden Figures (2016) and Extremely Wicked, Shockingly Evil and Vile (2019). Early in his life, Jim Parsons was born at St. Joseph's Hospital in Houston, Texas, and grew up in one of its northern suburbs, Spring. He is the son of Milton Joseph Mickey/Jack Parsons, Jr. and Professor Judy Ann (née McKnight). Her sister, Julie Ann Parsons, is also a teacher. [7] [8] After playing the role of the bird Kola-Kola in a school production of The Elephant's Child at the age of six, Parsons was determined to become an actor. [7] He attended Klein Oak High School in the spring. Parsons points out a role in Noises Off during his junior first year as the first time I fully connected with the role I was playing and began to really understand what it meant to be honest on stage. The young Parsons was heavily influenced by sitcoms, especially Three's Company, Family Ties and The Cosby Show. After graduating from high school, Parsons earned a bachelor's degree in theater from the University of Houston. He was prolific during that time, 17 pieces in three years. He was a founding member of Infernal Bridgroom Productions and has performed regularly at the Scene Directory Theatre. Parsons enrolled at the University of San Diego High School in 1999. [12] He was one of seven accepted into a special two-year course in classical theatre, taught in partnership with the Old Globe Theater. Program director Rick Seer recalls having reservations about Parsons' admission, saying, Jim is a very specific personality. It is very original, which is one of the reasons why it has been so successful. But we worried: Does this fit classical theatre? Does that fit the type of training we do? But we decided he was so talented that we would give him a try to see how it worked. Parsons loved school and told an interviewer that he would have pursued a PhD in action if possible: The school was so safe!..... You often surprised yourself with what you were capable of, and you were not surprised by certain things. Parsons earned a master's degree in drama from the Old Globe Theatre/University of San Diego in 2001 and moved to New York. Parsons tells the story of his family in TLC's Who Do You Think You Are? in September 2013 and discovered French heritage on his father's side. The French architect Louis-François Trouard (1729-1804) is six times great-grandfather of Jim. Career Parsons (right-back) in an 2002 adaptation of The Castle's Early Career In New York, Parsons worked in off-Broadway productions and made several television appearances. In a much-discussed 2003 quiznos commercial, Parsons played a man who had been raised by wolves and continued to breastfeed his wolf mother. He had a recurring role on the television show Judging Amy[15] and appeared in the television series Ed. [12] Parsons also had minor roles in several films, including Garden State and School for Scoundrels. [16] Revolutionary role in The Big Bang Theory Parsons estimated that he auditioned for between 15 and 30 television pilots, but on most occasions when he was cast, the show failed to find a television network ready to buy it. [12] The exception came with the Big Bang Theory. After reading the pilot script, Parsons felt that the role of Sheldon Cooper would be a very good fit for him. Although he felt no kind of relationship with the character, he was enchanted by the structure of the dialogue, the way the writers brilliantly use those words that most of us don't recognize to create that rhythm, and the rhythm got me. It was an opportunity to dance through this dialogue and, in many ways, it is still the case. [11] Parsons at the 2013 PaleyFest During his audition, Parsons impressed the series creator Chuck Lorre so much that Lorre insisted on a second audition to see if Parsons could replicate the performance. Parsons was cast as Sheldon a physicist with social apathy who frequently belittled his friends and the waitress who lives across the hall. The role required Parsons to be offline after the line of tightly composed rhythmic dialogues, as well as with his face or body during the silence that follows. Parsons credits his training at the University of San Diego by giving him the tools to break Sheldon's lines. [7] Television critic Andrew Dansby compared Parsons' physical comedy to that of Buster Keaton and other silent film stars. Lorre praises Parsons' instinct, saying, You can't teach that. Lorre describes Parsons' great sense of control over every part of his body, the way he walks, holds his hands, his head, facial tics as inspired. [16] Critic Lewis Beale described Parsons' performance as so punctual, it seems that the character and the actor are the same person. Parsons admits that work is more effort than I ever thought a sitcom would take, and that's really the pleasure of it. In August 2009, Parsons won the Television Critics Association Award for his individual achievements in comedy, defeating Alec Baldwin, Tina Fey, Steve Carell and Neil Patrick Harris. Parsons was nominated for the Primetime Emmy Awards in 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013 and 2014 for outstanding lead actor in a comedy series, won in 2010, 2011, 2013 and 2014. In September 2010, Parsons and co-stars Johnny Galecki and Kaley Cuoco signed new contracts, guaranteeing each of them \$200,000 per episode for the fourth season of The Big Bang Theory, with substantial increases for each of the next three seasons. All three were also promised a percentage of the show's earnings. In January 2011, Parsons won the Golden Globe for Best Actor in a Television Series - Comedy. [20] As of August 2013, Parsons, Cuoco and Galecki each earned \$325,000 per episode. In August 2014, Parsons, Galecki and Cuoco again signed new contracts, guaranteeing each of them \$1 million per episode for the eighth, ninth and tenth seasons of The Big Bang Theory, as well as quadrupled their percentage of the show's revenues to more than 1% each. In August 2018, Parsons announced his rejection of a \$50 million contract for Seasons 13 and 14. Producers simultaneously announced that after 279 episodes, most of all multi-camera series in television history, the show will come to an epic, creative closure in May 2019. Parsons was to remain in his role as narrator of the prequel series, Young Sheldon. [24] [25] Other Works In 2011, Parsons appeared with Jack Black, Owen Wilson, Steve Martin, and Rashida Jones in the comedy film The Big Year. It was released in October. The same year, he appeared as Walter's human alter ego, the most recent Muppet introduced in The Muppets. On May 18, 2012, Parsons to appear on Broadway as Elwood P. Dowd in a cover of Harvey. [28] Parsons received a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame on March 11, 2015. He voiced Oh, one of the leading roles in the animated film DreamWorks Comedy Home (2015), alongside Rihanna. [31] January 29, January, it was announced that Parsons would play the role of God in the Broadway production of David Javerbaum's New Play An Act of God directed by Joe Mantello. The play began premieres at Studio 54 on May 5, 2015.[33] and closed on August 2, 2015 to positive reviews. In 2017, Parsons began hosting his own SiriusXM talk show, Jim Parsons Is Too Stupid for Politics. The show lasted six weeks. In 2018, Parsons was one of the actors who wrote the audiobook A Day in the Life of Marlon Bundo. [36] Parsons' personal life lives in New York City[37] Gramercy Park neighborhood[38] while maintaining a residence in Los Angeles. His father died in a car accident on April 29, 2001. On May 23, 2012, a New York Times article noted that Parsons was gay and had been in a relationship for ten years. Her husband is artistic director Todd Spiewak. In October 2013, Parsons called their relationship an act of love, coffee in the morning, going to work, washing clothes, taking out dogs, a boring love. Parsons and Spiewak met in New York in May 2017. Parsons supported Democratic candidate Hillary Clinton in the 2016 U.S. presidential election.
