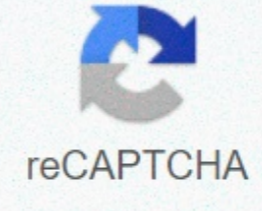

In 1802, Viceroy of New Spain appointed Miguel Domínguez to the Office of Corregidor (magistrate) in querétaro. During this period, Ortiz de Domínguez cared for household chores and the education of his 14 children. Ortiz de Domínguez developed early sympathy for the Amerind, Mestizo and the Community of Criollo, which was oppressed by the Spanish colonial government. The Amerinds were oppressed; Mestizos and creoli are often seen as second-class citizens and have been classified into secondary roles in colony management. This created a ruthlessness among the many Criollos, who soon began organising secret and literary companies to discuss the works of enlightenment banned by the Roman Catholic Church. Ortiz de Domínguez herself attended some of the early meetings and eventually persuaded her husband to hold numerous political meetings in their house. The meetings, attended by educated figures including Miguel Hidalgo y Costilla and Ignacio Allende, quickly turned to revolutionary issues. The meetings at the Ortiz de Domínguez house became the official location of the revolutionary conspiracy and there was a lot of rebel planning, including the collection of weapons and supplies and storage in various houses. The beginning of the revolution was scheduled for December 8, 1810. But on September 13, the conspirators issued a backing warning to the Spanish colonial authorities about the insurgent activities in Querétar. Colonial authorities, unaware of the loyalty of Domínguez's wife, asked Corregidor to conduct an investigation in the city to capture rebel leaders. He locked his wife, Ortiz de Domínguez, in her room to prevent her from sharing information with fellow conspirators. The rebels had plenty of leads, and Ortiz de Domínguez eventually managed to get a warning through the city's mayor, Don Ignacio Pérez. The news allowed the leaders of the plot to leave the city and prompted Miguel Hidalgo y Costillo to declare the war against The Spanish colonial authorities sooner than expected. In the early morning of September 16, 1810, he gave a speech to his followers, known as Grito de Dolores (Cry of Dolores), an event that signaled the beginning of Mexico's war of independence. Eventually, the role of Ortiz de Domínguez and her husband in the They were locked up separately. She was sent to santa clara monastery, querétaro, and then to Mexico City to stand trial. Despite her husband's efforts as a lawyer, she was found guilty at the Monastery of Santa Teresa and put her in the aboness. Due to its rebellious nature, she was soon transferred to the Monastery of Santa Catalina de Sena. Ortiz de Domínguez was released in 1817, under oath to abstain from supporting the rebellion. After the Independence War in 1822, the Mexican emperor Agustín de Iturbide offered Ortiz de Domínguez the role of a lady waiting for his wife, Ana María de Huarte y Muñiz. However, Ortiz de Domínguez believed that the establishment of the Mexican Empire, rather than the Republic, was against the ideals for which it fought in the revolutionary period, and refused to honor it. In 1823 she was named an honorary woman by the Emperor, a tribute she also condemned. In the late years of her life, Ortiz de Domínguez worked with several radical political groups. She has always denied any award for participating in the independence movement, claiming that she had only done her duty as a patriot. Ortiz de Domínguez died in 1829 in Mexico City. It was originally buried in the Monastery of Santa Catalina de Sena, but later her remains were moved to Querétaro. The Querétaro Government declared it Benemérita del Estado. In 1910, Ortiz de Domínguez [4] and Leona Vicario [5] were the first women to be depicted on Mexican brands and other women depicted on brands in Latin America. Her profile also appears at 5 centavos from 1942 to 1976,[6] and a version of the \$5 Mexican coin, surrounded by the words BICENTARIO DE LA INDEPENDENCIA, which means Bicentennial Anniversary of Independence. La Corregidora In 1791, Josefa Ortiz married Miguel Domínguez, who worked for the Revenue Service and the Office of the Virreinato de la Nueva España during those years.
