The long haul pdf

Since mid-March, like many of us, I have been working from home (WFH). For the first few weeks I was excited about the newly discovered flexibility of WFH and it was extremely productive. However, my productivity and satisfaction have changed significantly. Although laboratories have been partially reopened with limited capacity, those who do not have practical laboratory work to do at the moment (for example, people doing bioinformatic work and those who are waiting for the age of mice or for approval of a new protocol) are encouraged to stay at home. I happen to be one of those people for now, so my WFH journey will continue indefinitely. Therefore, after much reflection on what works and what doesn't, here are some of my best recommendations for working from home: Stick to your routine. Consider how many hours a day you will do the work if you continue to go to the lab. Just because your home is now your workplace doesn't mean you have to work 24 hours a day, 7 days a week! Try waking up at the same time each day on weekdays and overclocking and clocking out at fairly consistent times. When you're done, try to relax and not think about working the rest of the night, even if you're in the same place. Simulate an authentic work environment. If you stay in your pyjas all day and try to lie in bed to do the job, you probably just fall asleep (at least me). Try to set up a desk area for your work and make it as distracting as possible. Shower and dress up as if it really will help you stay productive! Keep notes. Although you may not be doing experiments in a wet lab, it is still beneficial to take notes about your daily tasks. Because, in these times, days tend to mix with each other, it can make life a lot easier to be able to refer to notes to remind yourself of what you're already working on! I try to take notes during each Zoom call I have so I remember what we discussed, and at the end of the meeting, always make sure we go the next steps so that I have clearly defined tasks and goals I can save for the coming week. Set up regular zoom conversations with principal investigator (PI) and labmates. My lab group has a big meeting every other week, and my PI has one-on-one meetings with each of its interns regularly. Being able to see each other's faces, discuss progress in our lab and check each other is no need to get tired just because you are now at home, this is a great time to learn the new skills that you have had time to continue. If some of your projects have fallen off the beaten track due to quarantine restrictions, this is the perfect time to discover new things. For example, bioinformatics and coding are beneficial skills to have – see my post on learning inspiration code! Take care of your body. The more you take care of yourself, the more efficient you will be when you work. While it's good to support local businesses and fulfill orders, it's also a great time to experiment with new healthy recipes. One of my favorite websites is Budget Bytes, where you can find countless delicious recipes that work on a student budget hail. Exercising and getting enough sleep are also critical. I discovered that when I'm in crisis, taking a break from work to do a workout, it de-sejuvenates me. Be gentle with yourself. In general, don't be so yourself. These are unprecedented, unimaginable times - I don't feel you have to be even more productive than usual because you're at home. If you already own a pickup truck, chances are you're already doing some pulling already for family, friends and neighbors. Starting your own pickup truck hauling business means you can make money in cash rather than hugs and pastries. Provided you only borrow locally without crossing state lines, you will need trucks, transportation equipment, insurance and company registration. If you don't already own a pickup truck, you'll probably want to get a one-ton truck that can carry £2,000. The £1,000 half-tone truck is perfect for carrying furniture or opening a delivery service, but you'll be limited in what you can also use it as a personal vehicle when you are not working. The disadvantage is that it has an open cab and is not suitable for higher loads.
