## Robert c johnson obituary

Robert Cornelius Bootsie Johnson, 45, of 732 Kentucky Parkway, Owensboro, died on Saturday, November 13, 2004, at his residence. He was born Juanite on September 26, 1959, and the late William Bootsie Johnson in Daviess County. Robert was a member of the Mt Calvary Baptist Church, loved playing chess, reading and loved his whole family. He was preceded by the death of his father, William Edward, Bootsie Winstead, and his grandmother, Fannie Johnson. Survivors include his wife of 19 years, Peggy Sue Johnson; one son, Cornelius Leon Johnson; two daughters, Tonia Pate and Tina Johnson, all of Owensboro; his mother, Juanita Johnson of Owensboro; three brothers, Larry Winstead and Darnell Johnson, both Owensboro; Jerry Winstead of Louisville; four sisters, Julia Lewis, Latonia Winstead, Lavinna Palmer and Bonnie Winstead, all of Owensboro; five grandchildren, Hannah Whitehouse, Bryonna Johnson, Dale Adams, Sennan Adams and Jarius Webb. Bob Johnson, 89, widower of Trula Bridges Johnson retired this earthly life and entered eternal celestial life May 2, 2014. He was born Howard C. and Elizabeth Hunter Johnson on November 12, 1924, in Jessamine County, Kentucky. He graduated from Lafayette High School in 1942, and was employed by the U.S. Army Signal Corps until being inducted into the U.S. Navy in July 1943. While in the Navy, he received training at Great Lakes, Wright Junior College in Chicago, the University of Houston and the Naval Research Lab in Washington, DC. He graduated from a laboratory rated RT2/c. He worked on the USS Charger (CVE 30) and PCE869, which was one of seven that were provided to Chinese nationalists under lend lease. Bob was one of 15 U.S. sailors stationed on PCE869 to train the Chinese crew after the ship was turned around. He was discharged from the Navy, April 1945, with an RT1/c rating. After returning to Lexington in October 1946, he joined the University of Kentucky and completed BSEE in January 1950. While a student in the UK, he was inducted into three honorary societies: Engineering-TauBetaPi, electric - EtaKappaNu, and physics - SigmaPiSigma. After graduating, he joined Shely Construction Co. as field superintendent of power line construction. While with Shely, he became Kentucky Registered Professional Engineer No. 2339. Resigning from Shely, in November 1953, he joined Kentucky Utilities as a distribution engineer, originally assigned to the Lexington District, then Winchester, Mt Sterling and Maysville counties in 1957. He and Trula Belle Bridges married on March 20, 2014. He resigned from KU in July 1968 and joined Commonwealth Associated, headquarters of a consulting engineering company in Jackson, Michigan, as a distributive engineer. Assigned to Lahore, western Pakistan, for a land reclamation project. They lived in Lahore for two years. Completing his contract in July 1970, he joined Sanderson and Porter, Inc., in September 1970 in New York. Assigned to Saigon, South Vietnam as resident manager of the transmission and distribution project, the Johnsons lived in Saigon until April 1973, when he was transferred to a home office, working as an electrical technician. In February 1976 he was assigned to Al Khubar, Saudi Arabia, as Resident Manager for a \$100 million engineering contract for a billion dollar sedanation and generation project. In 1977, he completed a year's assignment and went to Knoxville, TN. Entering the University of Tennessee, he graduated with an MBA in June 1979. Deciding he was too young to retire, Bob joined the U.S. Agency for International Development as an electrical technician and was assigned to the Jakarta, Indonesia, rural electrification project. Fifty months later, the Johnsons moved to Cairo, Egypt, which was assigned to produce and distribute projects. Completing fifty months in Egypt, they left for Knoxville, TN, in June 1988. They returned to Lexington in November 1993. He was preceded by the deaths of his parents Elizabeth and Howard Johnson, his sister Polly Lykins. He is survived by his sister, Jane Dinsmore, two nephews, Dale Howard Dinsmore and Robert Howard Lykins and numerous cousins. Throughout their lives, Mr. and Mrs. Johnson have been strong supporters of Clear Creek Baptist College, as well as several churches and charitable institutions. & Funeral Information & Celebration of life services will be performed by Dr. John Landon at 6pm, Monday, May 19, 2014 at Clark Legacy Center, Brannon Crossing.
