Johnson announced today that the University plans to begin celebrations on campus on October 9 and 10, 2020. Due to the spread of COVID-19, UMass Dartmouth was forced to cancel the ceremony originally scheduled for May 8 and 11, 2020. UMass Law School The start of the ceremony is scheduled for October 9 at the Angus Bailey Auditorium at campus center. Undergraduate and graduate commencement ceremonies are scheduled for October 10 at vietnam's Veterans Peace Memorial Amphitheater. The challenges our students overcame this semester to complete their studies were monumental, said Chancellor Robert E. Johnson. They deserve a ceremony on campus to celebrate their hard work and honor the dedication of our faculty and the staff who led them through these turbulent times. On March 11, UMass Dartmouth announced that all face-to-face courses would be delivered online, residence rooms were to be closed, and staff were expected to work remotely for the remainder of the semester to protect the safety and well-being of the entire campus community. The university turned to almost complete virtual surgery within a few days with minimal interruptions in the academic progress of students. To help with this transition, digital teaching workshops were offered to faculty and laptops were offered to students. While the University is committed to having on-campus commencement ceremonies, it will continue to follow all federal and Massachusetts security guidelines and protocols. If current social standards are in place in the fall of 2020, these ceremonies will be postponed until spring 2021. On July 1, 2020, UMass Dartmouth will welcome John A. Williams, Ph.D., as dean of Charlton College of Business. Williams most recently served as dean of the College of Business Administration at the University of New Orleans, a position he held since 2013. Prior to joining the University of New Orleans, he served as director of the Department of Hotel, Restaurant, Institution Management & Dietetics at Kansas State University and as a program coordinator for a bachelor's degree at Virginia Tech. Williams has published a number of articles in human resources with a basic focus of research on success, plateau, and derailment of managers. On On coordinated and sponsored annual research seminars with national experts to provide relevant information for New Orleans' economic growth. Much of his funded research focused on assessing resilience and transformational changes after Hurricane Katrina and the BP oil spill in a larger area of New Orleans. Since Katrina, he has raised more than \$550,000 in scholarship funding, \$2.5 million in sponsored grants and more than \$2.6 million in external funding. Williams has been president of the Southwestern Business Deans Association in the past and sits on the editorial board of Tourism Analysis, the European Journal of Tourism Research and Advances in Hospitality and Leisure. Since 2012, he has been a member of many AACSB International teams. He earned a Ph.D., master's degree, and a bachelor's degree in science from Pennsylvania State University.
