Fire protection in the city is provided jointly by the Bakersfield Fire Department and the Kern County Fire Department. The Kern County Fire Department also protects the county as a whole. Bakersfield is traditionally recognized as a border, dividing the territory of the Sureno and Norteno gangs. It has more than 363 officers and 100 professional officers covering an area of 145 square miles (380 km2) serving an urban population of more than 800,000. The current head of the department is Greg Terry. The department protects the city, divided between two districts: the Western District and the Eastern District, with the police headquarters in the east and the western substation serving west Bakersfield. The department's administration consists of a police chief, one assistant chief, four captains and eleven lieutenants. The department is headquartered at 1601 Truxtun Avenue. The western substation is located at 1301 Buena Vista Road. Satellite offices are located on 11th Street and White Lane. The range of the department's pistol is located on Truxtun Avenue, with the K-9 range next to the landfill. The department's training academy is located on Norris Road in conjunction with the Kern County Sheriff's Department. A 2015 study by Mapping Police Violence estimated that Bakersfield police killed civilians at the highest rate in the U.S., recording 13.6 homicides per million, compared with the U.S. average of 3.6. In 2015, BPD killed 13 people and killed 27 people by law enforcement officers in Kern County, which has a population of about 900,000. The Guardian reported that law enforcement officials in Kern County, California, killed more people per capita than any other U.S. county in 2015. The Bakersfield Fire Department has 14 stations scattered throughout the city. The Bakersfield Fire Department, known as the ECC (Emergency Communications Center), is located at the Whiting Communications Center in Northeast Bakersfield. The ECC is a joint dispatch center for Kern County, Bakersfield City, and California City Fire Departments. Built in 1988, the ECC is responsible for sending resources to an area of about 8,100 square miles (21,000 sq km), includes 65 fire stations. ECC ECC example Volume is 82,000 calls per year and handles emergency and emergency fire and medical 911 calls for the entire Kern County. The Kern County Fire Department (KCFD) is an agency that provides fire protection and emergency medical care for Kern County, California, USA. With more than 625 permanent staff and 100 additional staff help protect an area that covers more than 8,000 square miles (21,000 sq km) KCFD provides fire-fighting services to more than 500,000 citizens living in unincorporated areas of Kern County and the cities of Arvin, Delano, Maricopa, Macfarland, Ridgecrest, Schafter, Taft, Tehachapi and Vasco. This agency has a contract to provide dispatch services for the California City Fire Service, Kern Ambulance, based in Vasco, and an ambulance care unit based in Lake Isabella. More than 546 uniformed firefighters are stationed at 46 fire stations across the county. Due to the sheer number of county islands and jagged urban boundary lines in southern Bakersfield, the nearest fire station is dispatched to the incidents. State Route 178 consists of a short section of the freeway that runs from a point near the city center to the northeastern part of the city, although there is currently no direct highway connection between SR 99 and SR 178. Interstate 5 bypasses the city a few miles to the west, also served by a short, unsigned, four-lane freeway called the Alfred Harrell Highway. It was built between 1956 and 1958 and stretches from the Chinese hail loop to Hart Park (large (large Park in Northeast Bakersfield)). To the east of the park there is also a two-lane expressway. This section was originally reserved for conversion into a four-lane highway similar to the western part built. If it was ever built, it would have two interchanges (on Morning Drive and Lake Min Road) and would be discontinued on the SR 178 accepted alignment (not built). Both SR 58 and SR 178 have planned future expansions. The western extension of the SR 58 is known as the Centennial Corridor, which will extend the freeway west to I-5. The Centennial Corridor includes the Westside Parkway (sometimes referred to by its official name, the Kern River Freeway). It is a newer freeway that runs through West Bakersfield, along the route parallel to the Kern River and stockdale Highway. The western extension of SR 178 is known as the Crossown Freeway/SR 178 Connection, although it was previously known as the Centennial Corridor before the name was moved to SR 58. It is planned to connect SR 178 to Westside Parkway. In addition to these motorway extensions, there is also a proposed network of belts. Two belts are currently being considered in Bakersfield. The Western Beltway will run from north to south of the seventh standard Taft Highway. It will run parallel to Heath Road in the north and parallel to South Allen Road in the south. The future expansion will connect the Western Belt with SR 99 and I-5, providing a bypass for Bakersfield. The South Beltway will run from east to west from SR 58 to I-5. From SR 58, it will run south, parallel to Comanche Drive to Taft Highway. From there, the freeway will turn west, and run parallel to the Taft Highway before ending on I-5. The future extension will expand the freeway north to SR 178 and stop on the Alfred Harrell Highway. Bakersfield also assumed that Caltrans would build the Northern Belt as a western extension of the SR 58, but this was withdrawn in favor of the Centennial Corridor. Bakersfield is currently one of the largest cities in the U.S. that is not directly connected to the interstate highway. However, SR 99 and SR 58 were considered for conversion to Interstates. The SR 99 will be a new Interstate signed either as Interstate 7 or Interstate 9, while the SR 58 will be an I-40 extension that currently ends in Barstow. In 2005, the SR 99 was added to FHWA's priority corridor list as California Farms to market the route and designated a future interstate. The Garces Memorial Movement Circle, informally known as the Garces Circle or simply the Circle, is the only circle of movement in Bakersfield, California. The transportation circle is located at the intersection of Chester Avenue, Golden State Avenue (State Route 204) and 30th Street in Bakersfield. The circle was built around 1932 as part of the U.S. 99. Large sculpture of Francisco was erected inside the circle in 1939. There are 18 routes, most of which serve the urbanized part of the county, which includes the city of Bakersfield. Bakersfield is also served by Kern Transit, which connects Bakersfield with other communities in Kern County. Long-distance bus providers in Bakersfield include Greyhound, FlixBus, Orange Belt Stages, Intercalifornias, TUFESA, and Fronteras del Norte. Amtrak Rail for Freight, Bakersfield is operated directly by two Class-1 railroads, Union Pacific and BNSF. To the north of the city, each railway uses its own railway lines; south of the city, they share a line owned by Union Pacific. The route passes through the Tehachapi Pass (and through the Tehachapi loop). There are several Spurs lines in and around Bakersfield. Most are operated by the San Joaquin Valley Railroad, owned by Genesee and Wyoming. Passenger services are provided on the San Joaquin route operated by Amtrak California. Bakersfield Amtrak Station is located in the city center, at the intersection of S Street and Truxtun Avenue. The city is the southern end of the route. There are five amtrak Thruway Motorcoach routes that connect passengers with destinations to the west, south and east. Kern Transit also uses the station as one of its hubs, connecting passengers with regions throughout Kern County. The Bakersfield station is planned as part of California's high-speed rail system, which is currently under construction. Meadows Field Meadows Field Airport in Bakersfield was recently rebuilt and dedicated as the William M. Thomas Terminal. In addition, the airport is home to the Hall Medivac helicopter, the International Academy of Flight Training (a subsidiary of the Japanese airline ANA Airlines), the SRT Helicopter flight school and many other aviation mechanics and equipment. However, in March 2014, IFTA suspended its activities.
