All online undergraduates are intended for transfer students working on a specific career. With this in mind, students can complete their education in 2 years while studying at their own pace. Students should have already completed their lower lower loans in another institution. There are currently 7 fully online graduate programs, as well as a hybrid bachelor's degree in middle-grade education. Appalachian State also offers master's programs online and hybrid formats, as well as graduate certificates. Each program at each level is taught with one goal in mind: to advance the career of the student. The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill Often recognized as one of the most prestigious schools in the country, the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill is a leader in many areas, including online education. Most online students at UNC are graduates, and most are involved in public health or health sciences. Public health accounts for the largest part of the online graduate program with 3 master's degrees, 1 doctoral and 6 certificates. UNC is considered a global leader in health sciences, and the same respect for their programs on campus extends to their online programs. UNC does not have a fully online undergraduate program, but they offer many undergraduate courses online. All necessary basic courses can be completed online for active military and veterans, so these students can study feasibly according to a hybrid diploma or complete their diploma in less time than the traditional 4 years. Various continuing education courses are also available online. North Carolina State University Among the best research schools in the country, North Carolina State University attracted world-class staff and faculty, improving the quality of education. For students considering an online school at NC State, it can help them know that the same faculty teaches both on campus and online. Theology Founded in 1995, apex school of theology is one of the younger institutions in the country. Despite a short time teaching higher education, Apex has already established itself as a top Christian school with a focus on African-American culture. There are only 7 major programs offered on Apex - 1 bachelor's degree, 4 master's degrees, 1 doctoral degree and 1 associate degree - in addition to their continuing educational programs. However, students will not have to travel to campus to do any of their studies. Offers all your graduate programs completely online with each course reflecting the same quality and difficulty as their versions on campus. Online courses are also offered in the traditional 16 week format or a shortened 8-week session. Regardless of where students live, Apex charges a peacock per class, with different fees applied to different levels of degrees. This structure is intended to keep education costs low, since the programs are intended for students who work. Western Carolina Western Carolina University started as a teaching school, but quickly grew into much more. While teaching is still one of the most popular subjects for students studying at the WCU, other programs, such as nursing and engineering, have begun to attract more national attention. University of North Carolina Wilmington Joining the UNC system nearly 50 years ago, the University of North Carolina Wilmington may not be the oldest or most prominent institution in North Carolina, but they have gained national attention. Their dedication to student experience and innovation is noticeable not only by the growth of the school, but also by the growth of their online program. Online undergraduate degrees like UNC Wilmington are similar to those found in other schools, except for a few of their majors. For example, their bachelor's degree in exercise science is a unique program for both their academics and format. UNC Charlotte online program is in 4 faculties: education, engineering, liberal arts & science and health & human services. Each of these faculties has multiple undergraduate and graduate opportunities, some of which are 4-year programs that can be completed entirely online. Some of the specific programs may also require personal experience; For example, to become a certified teacher in North Carolina, students in an online education school will still need to obtain a license through clinical experience. Anyone concerned about the quality of UNC Charlotte's online school should know that all online courses are taught by the same professors who teach on campus. Grace College of Divinity Location Fayetteville, NC Formerly known as grace leadership institute, Grace College of Divinity is a Christian school that offers education on 1 of 4 paths: leadership, worship, ministry and family life. After that, there are only 4 undergraduate options on GCD, each followed by at least one of these songs. degrees are available in a variety of ways, including fully online. Online courses have students getting involved in online discussion boards, keeping everyone within the GCD community.
