RNs, or registered nurses, are health professionals who work directly with patients in a wide variety of health care situations and settings. Although RNs often work in hospitals, they can also work in private medical offices and clinics. Each state has its own licensing regulations and policies for registered nurses, either through a dedicated nursing board or through the state's health department. The validity duration of an RN license varies by state, but is usually two years or more. A nurse who completes a nursing education program and passes all state tests receives an initial license, which requires renewal on a specified date. Subsequent licenses are valid for several years after issuance. For example, in California, a new nurse receives a license that is valid until the month after the RN's second anniversary of receiving the license. Each subsequent renewal lasts two additional years from the date of issue. The process of applying for an RN license renewal involves providing basic contact information and filing a fee with the state nursing board or health department. Some states require RNs to complete continuing education between each renewal date. For example, in California, each RN must be able to show proof of at least 30 hours of continuing education since the last license renewal in order to renew once again. This requirement ensures that RNs remain aware of changes and advances in health care. Nurses who renew their licenses on time receive new licenses by mail and can continue to practice without interruption. Those applying for late renewal may have to pay an additional late renewal fee or, in certain cases, stop practicing until the renewed license but with an inactive status due to not yet completing sufficient continuing education. An inactive license is activated and allows the holder to practice once the RN has completed all necessary training and education credits. Each allows residents to renew their driver's licenses several months before the expiration date. The process is similar to renewing at the normal time, although there are some differences for particular groups of people. Renewal requirements and deadlines vary by state, so contact your state's motor vehicle department for specific information. Renewal Requirements If you decide to renew online or by phone, you must verify your identity with information such as your full name, driver's license number, date of birth and Social Security number. You may also need a printer for the online option to print a temporary license to use until the new one arrives, if this is a requirement in your state. In some states, you are only eligible for these renewal options if you need a vision exam, but you need to file an electronic report from an approved vision certification provider. When renewing by mail, include a completed license application form, an eye detection report from an ophthalmologist, and a check or money order for the fee. If you renew in person, take your current license, renewal notice if you have received one and your glasses or contacts for proof of vision, if applicable. Non-citizens must bring documentation proving their legal presence, such as a work permit or federal I-94 travel document. Out-of-state renewalsYou can request an early renewal by mail if you are out of state or country and will not return before your license expires. Write a letter to your state's motor services department to explain your situation and request a renewal. Include a full license application, a view evaluation report, a check or money order for the rate, your address both in the state and outside state and a self-directed sealed envelope for your license. With few exceptions, you must renew expired licenses Committee on Motor Vehicles (MVC). New Jersey does not allow online renewals. New Jersey driver's licenses expire four years after the date of issue. You have up to three years to renew yours after it expires, but it's illegal to keep driving with it until you do. You must apply for a new license if the three-year grace period has been lost. Like any new applicant, you have to pass written, driving and eye tests if you reapply for the license. New Jersey offers Skip the Trip mail renewal service for licenses that are still valid, but you cannot use it if your license has expired. You must renew in person so that MVC can take a new digital photo of you. The state uses a six-point identification, such as a birth certificate, is worth two points while a secondary is worth one. You must present sufficient identification to earn the six points needed to begin the renewal process. Mvc also requires a vision test and an application fee. As of 2015, this fee is \$24. MVC will allow you to renew your expired license by mail if you cannot do so in person because you are out of state or country for an extended period of time. You can renew this way for a basic car license (Class D) but not for a commercial driver's license (Class A, B, C). Complete the Driver's license application form and write a letter explaining why you cannot renew in person. Also, include copies of your identification documents that meet the six-point requirement, a check or money order for the \$24 fee, and a return envelope for your renewed license. MVC suggests sending a trace envelope. Call the apartment at (609) 292-6500 to request the form. Active military personnel who have been deployed receive automatic extensions so that their licenses do not expire in their absence. When they return, they have two weeks to renew their licenses in MVC following the regular procedure. They can use their licenses before renewal, but they must carry documentation that shows their special status and the extension provided by MVC. The Virginia Department of Motor Vehicles allows customers to do so online, by mail, or in person. However, if your license has expired, you must renew it in person. The process requires valid in seven to 10 business days. A Virginia driver's license is generally valid for eight years and expires on the holder's birthday, but there are some exceptions. For example, if you obtained your license when you were 16, it is valid for only four years, until your Birthday. If you're 75 or older, it expires without penalty. If it has expired for more than a year, you should re-take the vision exam, driving knowledge test and driving skills test to renew it. This is similar to applying for a license as a new applicant. Visit the DMV and complete a license application, checking the renewal option. You must show proof of your legal presence unless you have done so once before as of January 1, 2004, in which case you are not required to provide proof of legal presence. Acceptable documents include your U.S. birth certificate, U.S. passport, naturalization documents, and permanent residence card. Display two forms of identification, such as the primary documents listed and the employer-issued photo ID card. Pay the \$32 processing fee starting in 2015, and take a vision test. The department will mail your license. The DMV extends driver's licenses for up to three years for people working outside the country, such as active-duty military personnel, diplomatic service members, and civilian employees or contractors for the U.S. government. This also applies to your spouses and dependents. If you are eligible, visit the DDMV website to request an extension. The department will send you a package that contains an app and other information you need to get an extension. The DMV will issue an extension card that you must carry with your expired license. You have up to 180 days to renew your license when you return. Return.
