To do this, B kind created his first club at St. Luke's School in New Canaan. Through this platform, the club establishes their students as ambassadors of kindness, where they can use their leadership experience to organize acts of kindness. The club has recently made ornaments in a retirement home with the elderly, allowing them to establish deep ties with residents and brighten up their day. In addition, the club and the organisation as a whole are working on a petition to make November 13 World Day of Kindness officially recognized, not to promote a separate agenda, but simply to remind people to be kind. Organization is a perfect example of how New Canaan residents always strive to be kind so that they can make a difference in other people's lives, rather than for personal gain. The Ram Council is an organization that works to promote substance-free living within New New High School, also supporting general well-being including exercise, nutrition and mental health. In order to support the club and its message, parents donate homemade meals to monthly Ram Council dinner meetings. Although this may seem like a small act, it allows children to relax and eat together, eventually facilitating an inclusive and supportive environment. The group is supported by the First Selectman, religious groups, and institutions such as Bankwell, contributing to the organization's success and exemplified New Canaan's commitment to supporting clubs such as Ram Council and embracing positivity and kindness. New Canaan Cares promotes residents' well-being, teaches students how to be leaders, and brings the community closer together. One of their most important functions is the Leadership Program, which allows high school students to improve their leadership and communication skills while at the same time volunteering within the community. This program pushes students out of their comfort zone by having teens to be compassionate with a range of people.
