Grippin was charged with one count of Promoting a child's sexual performance, a Class D crime, after the CPD conducted an investigation with the assistance of the New York State Police Computer Crime Unit into allegations that Grippin was observed to possess child pornography. After receiving the complaint, CPD members made a search warrant at Grippin's residence. Many electronic devices owned by Grippin were seized and later submitted to the New York State Police Computer Crime Unit for forensic analysis. Links analysis showed that many child pornography images were found. See. was charged in Cobleskill Town Court and transferred to the Schoharie County Receiving Facility with a \$5 million cash bail or \$15 million bond. Grippin will appear again at Cobleskill Town Court on October 23, 2018 at 5:00pm to continue the action. Anyone with information about this incident is asked to contact Lt. Bailey, 24 years old, Fultonville NY on Tuesday, September 18, 2018 at 8:50 a.m. following a brief investigation with the U.S. Postal Inspection Service. On Tuesday, September 11, 2018, the Cobleskill Police Department received a report from the U.S. Postal Inspection Service about an incident that occurred at cobleskill Post Office on Friday, September 7, 2018. It has been reported that a female suspect who is not a USPS employee entered the Post Office during normal working hours wearing a U.S. Postal Service uniform, and in doing so acted in a way that led Postal Service employees to believe that she was also a USPS employee. The female suspect was able to reach the Safe Area of the Post Office and while the saleswoman was distracted, the female suspect was able to steal \$400.00 from the cash machine. The burglary was not discovered until a day later after the suspect left. During the investigation, the female suspect was later identified as Brittany L. Bailey, and a number of UNFIROMS were recovered from her. Bailey is charged with Petit Larceny and Criminal Impersonation at level 2, both offences of class A. Bailey was released on a ticket and will appear in Cobleskill Town Court on October 16, 2018 at 5:00 p.m.###
