A greater selection of course topics Hidden Message by Chuck Missler • February 1, 1996 We often use the well-known term gospel, or good news. Where is the first place to appear in the Bible? The answer may surprise you. The integrated message of the Great Discovery is that the Bible is a system of references: it is not only 66 books written by 40 authors over thousands of years, the Bible is an integrated whole that carries evidence of supernatural engineering in every detail. A Jewish rabbi has a curious way of expressing this idea: they say they don't understand Scripture until the Messiah arrives. But when it comes, it will not only interpret every passage for us, it will interpret the words themselves; He will even interpret the letters themselves; In fact, it will even interpret the spaces between the letters! When I first heard it, I just dismissed it as a colorful exaggeration. Until I read Matthew 5:17–18: Do not think I have come to destroy the Torah and the prophets; I'm not here to destroy, but to fulfill. For my part I say to you: Until heaven and earth pass, one jot or one tittle will not be in any wise way to move from the law until all is met. (Jot and tittle are the Hebrew equivalent of our dotting i and crossing t.) Example A remarkable example of this can be seen in Genesis Chapter 5, where we have the genealogy of Adam through Noah. This is one of the chapters that we often tend to collect over quickly as we pass Genesis it's simply genealogy from Adam to Noah. But God always rewards a caring student. Let us look at this chapter in more detail. We read Hebrew names in our Bible. What do these names mean in English? Studying the original roots the importance of the right names can be difficult to chase, since direct translation is often not readily available. Even a conventional Hebrew lexicon can be disappointing. Studying the original roots, however, can yield some fascinating insights. (Note: many study aids, such as a conventional lexicon, may prove rather superficial when dealing with proper nouns. Moreover, opinions on the meanings of the original roots are not without controversy and variant data.) Let's take an example. The flood judgment of Methuselah comes from the muth, the root that means death; [1] and from the charade, which means to bring or forward. The name Methuselah means his death will bring. [2] Methuselah's father received a prophecy about the coming Great Flood, and was apparently told that as long as his son was alive, the flood judgment would be withheld, but once he has died, the flood will be brought in or sent out. (Can you imagine raising a child like that? Every time a boy caught a cold, the whole neighborhood must have panicked!) And indeed, the year Methuselah died, a flood came. [3] It is interesting that Methuselah's life, in fact, was a symbol of God's mercy in the passing of the upcoming flood judgment. Therefore, it is appropriate that his life be the oldest in the Bible when we talk about the vastness of God's mercy. Other names! If there is such meaning in the name of Methuselah, let's explore other names to see what may lie behind them. Adam Adam's name means man. As the first man, it seems pretty straightforward. Seth Adam's son has been named Seth, meaning named. Eva said: "For God's sake, he named me another seed instead of Abel, whom Cain killed." [4] Enosh Seth's son was called Enosh, which means mortal, fragile or unhappy. It is from the root of anash, to be untreatable, used wounds, sadness, woe, disease, or wickedness. It was in the Enosh times that people began to tarnish the name of the Living God. [5] Kenan Enosh's son has been named Kenan, which can mean sadness, dirge, or elegy. (The exact font is somewhat elusive, some study aids unfortunately assume that Kenan is synonymous with cainan.) Balaam, looking down from the heights of Moab, uses a pun to name the Kenites as he prophesies their destruction. [6] We have no real idea why these names were chosen for their children. Often they can refer to circumstances at birth, and so on. Mahalalel Kenan's son was mahalalel, from mahalal, which means or praise; and El, a name for God. Thus, Mahalalel means Blessed God. Often Hebrew names include El, the name of God, as Dan-i-el, God is my judge, etc. Jared Mahalalel's son was named Jared, of the verb yaradh, meaning to descend. [7] Enoch Jared's son was named Enoch, which means learning or beginning. He was the first of four generations of preachers. In fact, the oldest recorded prophecy was Enoch, which is wonderfully enough to deal with the second coming of Christ (even if it is quoted in the Book of Jude in the New Testament): Enoch also, the seventh of Adam, prophesied of them, saying, Behold, the Lord will come with ten thousand of his saints to carry out judgment at all, and to persuade all who are punent among them of all their god deeds, which have been godlessly committed and of all their harsh manifestations against which goded sinners spoke. – Jude 14–15 Methuselah Enoch was the father of Methuselah, whom we have already mentioned. Enoch walked with God after begat Methuselah. [8] It appears that Enoch received the prophecy of the Great Flood, and I was told that as long as his son was alive, the flood judgment would be withheld. The year Methuselah died, the flood came. Enoch, of course, never died: he was translated[9] (or, if you excuse the term, raped). This is how Methuselah may have been the oldest man in the Bible, but he died before his father! Lamech Methuselah's son was named Lamech, the root still evident today in our own English word, lament or lament. Lamech suggests despair. (This name is also associated with Lamech in the Cain line, who inadvertently killed his son Tubal-Cain in a hunting incident. [10]) Noah Lamech, of course, is the father of Noah, who is derived from nacham, to bring relief or comfort, as Lamech himself explains in Genesis 5:29. Composite list Now let's put it all together: Hebrew English Adam Man Seth appointed Enosh Mortal Kenan mourning; Mahalalel Blessed God Jared zodi Enoch teaching Methuselah His death will bring Lamech a desperate Noah Rest, or comfort. This is quite remarkable: A man (is) appointed a mortal sadness; (but) A blessed God will inherit the teachings (that) His death will bring (a) desperate rest. Here is the gospel hidden in genealogy in Genesis! (Never convince me that a group of Jewish rabbis conspire to hide the Christian gospel here in genealogy within their revered Torah!) Design evidence The implications of this discovery are more extensive than can be seen at a glance. It shows that in the first chapters of the Book of Genesis, God has already laid out His plan of redemption for the difficulties of mankind. It's a love story, written in blood on a wooden cross that was built in Judea nearly 2,000 years ago. The Bible is an integrated messaging system, a product of supernatural engineering. Every number, every place name, every detail, every jot and tittle is there for our learning, our discovery, and our amazement. Indeed, our God is an amazing God. It is surprising to find out how many biblical controversies seem to evaporate if one simply recognizes the unity and integrity of these 66 books, written by 40 authors over thousands of years. It is remarkable how many subtle discoveries lie behind the small details of the text. Some of them are immediately apparent with a small study; some of them are more technical and require special help. Many of these discoveries are described in our briefing pack, Beyond Coincidence. Several of them are also highlighted in our briefing pack, The Creator for Time and Space. Look beyond every detail: there's a discovery to be made! God always rewards a caring student.
