The verb hacer (do/make) is probably the most used Spanish-speaking moving verb, because it is completely irregular in evocative of the first person. There are certain moving verbs that are formed using different prefixes, such as rehacer (do it again) and deshacer (cancel). These prefixes change the meaning of the main verb, but the conjugation pattern remains the same as the original hacer.
