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The Early College High School Initiative in the United States allows students to receive a high school diploma and an associate's degree, or up to two years of college credit, by taking a mix of high school and college classes. This differs from dual enrollment, where students are enrolled in a traditional high school and take college classes, while early college students take high school classes in preparation for full college workloads.
