The "learn guitar books" both acoustic and electric are here to stay since thousands of guitar lesson books are being sold every day.

For this reason, I thought I would buy, read, review and compare a couple of these books and see how they perform. Now the moment you've been waiting for, here are my reviews of the most popular guitar learning books.

They are in no particular order in the list, but I will give you my recommendation on which one is best afterward. This paperback is the best selling learn guitar book on Amazon. It does not include a CD or any form of multimedia. Sort of like a hit-and-run guitar primer. It is aimed at complete beginners and stops at the beginner level. I won't go into detail on the exact contents of the book, you can see that in the table of contents in the picture gallery below.

If you wanted to spend a bit more, or are looking Complete Learn to Play Guitar Manual: Beginner to Professional Level a book for yourself, I would go with the 2nd book reviewed below, the Guitar for Dummies book. It has online video and audio demos, and hearing what you should be playing helps when learning music. With this new edition, they scrapped the DVD from the previous version and introduced online video and audio clips as a supplement to the book's teachings.

They didn't take it overboard though, with just 85 videos and 95 audio tracks, but at least it's a step in the Complete Learn to Play Guitar Manual: Beginner to Professional Level direction. You can't learn music by just reading about it, you need audible tools.

Reading through the Guitar for Dummies book, it is apparent that unlike the Teach Yourself to Play Guitar book above, this one is not meant solely for beginners. It has lots of info and theory, that would be useful for the intermediate level guitarist. Beyond teaching the basics, this book goes into the particulars of different genres as well. Having been just released, this new edition doesn't have any reviews yet at the time of this writing. This Hal Leonard guitar book is actually a series of 3 books, each around 50 pages, and it comes with 3 supplemental CDs which you can refer to during the chapters.

I would recommend this book to younger students under It also has an overwhelming amount of sheet music in it. These music sheets allow you to practice what is being taught in the given chapter, which is nice, but going through the books, I felt there was a lot left unexplained. Another negative I found was that this book focuses more on traditional music notation, and places guitar tablature into the background.

As a guitar teacher, I believe that tabs are the next best thing to sliced bread since it makes learning much easier for beginner guitarists. And since learning the guitar is hard, anything that makes it simpler is more than welcome.

On the other hand, if you want to learn to read standard music notation, this will be the way to go for you. The lesson curriculum is not really my style, but all teachers vary.

It focuses too soon on too much theory, and I believe in getting my students playing and having fun, thereby develop a love for the instrument quickly, rather than indulging in theoretical studies.

This book was first published in the s, and used to be one of the most popular learn guitar books. It does not include a CD or any form of multimedia, which is a major turnoff. It also has way too much text and not enough graphics. Because of these factors, I do not recommend this book at all.

It focuses on acoustic guitar, so those of you specifically looking to learn the electric, will need to keep on looking. The structure of the lessons are good, it varies between guitar technical stuff and theory as you progress, meaning that you won't get bored of any single topic, and you'll have a chance to try out the theoretical bits one step at a time.

It's a shame they never made newer editions of this book with more graphics and supplemental audio-video tools. Reading the written reviews of this beginners guitar book, I get the impression that most people who wrote the reviews are not too far along in the book though. Here is one of the most useful reviews: At the end of reading I knew a little bit about a lot of different guitar techniques, but I certainly didn't feel like I knew everything I needed to play guitar well.

I would recommend spending the money on some lessons, when I finally broke down and started taking lessons, I learned more in a week than I did from reading the whole book. Guitar Aerobics was first published in It is a unique kind of guitar book, as it gives you 1 exercise to carry out for every single day of the year. The exercises start out with basic drills, and progress into harder licks. What kind of exercises can you expect?

Each day of the week, you get a different type of exercise to keep things varied and interesting: Monday : Alternate picking, Tuesday : String skipping, Wednesday : String bending, Thursday : Arpeggios, Friday : Sweep picking, Saturday : Legato, Sunday : Rhythm

This book isn't specifically for beginner guitar players, as it isn't a course book. Nevertheless, it makes for a great Complete Learn to Play Guitar Manual: Beginner to Professional Level book to a beginner's guitar studies.

Remember, the book provides 1 exercise a day. It pushed your limits each and every day in baby steps, Complete Learn to Play Guitar Manual: Beginner to Professional Level after days, you will definitely Complete Learn to Play Guitar Manual: Beginner to Professional Level a better guitar player than you are today.

You have to spend time with each exercise though, you can't just rush through things. You won't be able to play all of the exercises up to speed on day 1, so you Complete Learn to Play Guitar Manual: Beginner to Professional Level revisit them again and again until you get them perfected. The reason I like the concept behind this guitar book is that it forces the student to pick up the guitar every single day. The only way to progress at the guitar is to practice regularly, and by its nature, this 1 exercise per day book sets out to do just that.

The book has an audio file for each exercise as well as backing tracks to play along with. These can be accessed through the Hal Leonard publishing company's website. Customer reviews of this book are overwhelmingly positive, with an average 4. If you've been learning to play guitar for a while, you will have undoubtedly heard references to music theory bits that you didn't understand.

This is a book meant to fill these holes in your knowledge. Learning music theory is not important for beginner guitarists, but after reaching an intermediate level, learning about music theory really helps in putting it all together. It covers pretty much everything a guitarist needs to know with respect to music theory.

The book starts out with the fretboard, key signatures, intervals, and continues on to teach about scales, chords construction, key centers. Towards the end, it teaches modes and modal harmony, chord substitution and reharmonization as well. What I really liked about the book is that it has quizzes to get you to test your knowledge. Also, there are about audio tracks demonstrating what is being taught, which is very important in learning music.

After garnering hundreds of reviews, it scores an average of 4. Other books covering the subject don't score so high since music theory is sometimes presented in a boring tone. If you think you are ready to dive into the world of guitar theory, here are a few pages from Music Theory for Guitarists. This book is not one of the most popular ones on Amazon, but I wanted to include it in this list of the best guitar books because it is one of the better ones out there.

This one is sort of like the Guitar for Dummies book. It touches on just about everything guitar related, from basic chords and techniques, all the way to how to purchase an amp. The author wanted to squeeze every bit of info into this book, so some chapters are a bit short. This, of course, doesn't really cut it nowadays, when everything is online. I don't even have a CD player anymore This is a nice book to have on your shelf, in case you need to refer to something quickly.

It's not suitable for outright learning guitar from as a sole resource though. Here are a few pages from the Teach Yourself Visually Book, but if you hop over to Amazon you can view many more pages from the book:

I've found through trial and error that this works in familiarizing my students thoroughly with the guitar and keeps them motivated at the same time. If you are a beginner, here are the subjects you should be looking for when choosing a guitar book. If a beginner book doesn't cover these subjects, then it will leave gaps in your knowledge or not offer enough motivation to keep on practicing.

If the book has more subjects Complete Learn to Play Guitar Manual: Beginner to Professional Level great, it means that it was written not just for beginners, more advanced guitarists as well. If you are looking for a guitar teaching book aimed at children, the ones in this list will not do.

The world has evolved, and there are much better, easier, beginner friendly methods nowadays which are much more suitable for learning music. After all, music is an audible art, you need to hear it. Of course, you will have to read at some points of your guitar studies ie. That's why it's nice to have a book as well to be able to read up on the details of something you're interested in.

I recommend the Guitar for Dummies book for this since it holds a lot of valuable info. As a complementary book, the Guitar Aerobics book can be very useful in keeping you practicing every day.

The variety of resources can sometimes be overwhelming. So it is good to know where to look. You can add YouTube guitar videos as a supplement to this structured learning system. A guitar consists of six strings that vary in size. From top to bottom the strings are numbered. The thickest string that sits atop the guitar is called the low E or the sixth string. The low E has the deepest or lowest sound.

The high E sits at the bottom of the guitar and is the thinnest chord, resulting in the highest pitch. Ernie Ball is an excellent brand of strings for all levels of guitarists. You may have to replace your strings if they get worn down and if they become hard to tune.

Any reliable guitar store will usually help you choose the strings suitable to you. They can also restring your guitar or show you how to do it yourself. The fretboard is the long wooden fingerboard of the guitar in which you place your fingers. A standard guitar consists of 22 frets. Each fret has a metal barrier separating it from the other frets.

The 1st fret is the one closest to the head of the guitar. Frets are numbered in order from When practicing the basics of the guitar, count the frets to

familiarize yourself with their placement.

When you place your finger on a fret the key or sound of the string will change. Each fret results in a different note for every string. For example, when placing a finger on the first fret of the low E string, the note will change from an E to an F. As a beginner, you will likely stay around the first few frets when you Complete Learn to Play Guitar Manual: Beginner to Professional Level. The first basic guitar chords you learn will be based on the 2nd, 3rd and fourth frets.

As you develop you will learn to use more of the guitar. The length of the fretboard can seem intimidating at first. But Complete Learn to Play Guitar Manual: Beginner to Professional Level will soon dissuade you of these notions of complexity.

The fretboard is a simple structure to understand. The more practice you do the more familiar you will become with the layout of the fretboard and how you can go from one end to the other with speed. There are many different ways to pick, so experimenting with how you hold the pick and strum will depend on you.

However, there are some fundamental things you need to learn. The most important thing to know about picking is that a guitar pick should be held between your thumb and pointer finger. The pointy edge of the pick will face the strings of the guitar. The rounded edge will be placed under the thumb and on the side of the pointer finger.

It is important to feel comfortable when using a pick. Most guitar picks for beginners will be light and easy to use. When you become more advanced you can begin to use firmer picks.

After a while, it will come down to personal preference. Ultimately, the important thing to remember is to not let the pick get in the way of your playing.

Depending on your favorite genre of music you may learn to pick in a certain way. It is always useful to be aware of how different musicians and genres utilize picking styles to enhance the musicality of their song or piece. If used properly the pick will help to give your strums a full and round sound.

Similarly, a pick can enhance the percussive sound of your playing and unlock new avenues of expression for your playing. As a beginner, you may want to stick to just using your fingers but you should also give a pick a try.

It is an easy way to add a new dynamic to your playing without necessarily altering your practice routines. Of the learning to play guitar basics, finger placement and finger strength is one of the most important. Before you play notes and chords you must become comfortable with the placement of your fingers.

As you Complete Learn to Play Guitar Manual: Beginner to Professional Level, your finger dexterity will probably not be fantastic. When you get the 5th fret, the finger placement will reset, once again beginning with your pointer. This idea will remain the same for the remainder of the fretboard. When you play the guitar for the first time, you will find it difficult to press down on the string! You need to strengthen your fingers to become comfortable with the sensation.

This can only be accomplished through repetition and practice. Many beginners give up before they pass this stage of pain and discomfort. Pressing down on the strings and moving from one chord to another will get easier with time. As long as you focus on finger placement as a beginner you should be able to advance your technique and skills at a steady pace. You have to spend that time on the basics of the guitar before anything else.

Any guitar guide for beginners will recommend that you take some proper instruction from a professional guitarist or teacher. As long as you can find a reliable teacher it is definitely worth the investment.

Your first guitar lessons will help with finger placement and finger strength. You will also learn how to strum and you might get some contextual information about the history and use of the guitar.
