The action takes place at a lighthouse and the nearby shoreline and ocean. Find *The Mystery of Rascal Pratt* at your local library. A brave Danish girl helps smuggle her Jewish friends to safety. A riveting read, but your kids may have questions afterward. Find *Number the Stars* at your local library. This book is a funny, poignant book about *October the First is Too Late* on the home front during World War II.
